Workforce Development Services

Youth and Adult Participants receive:

- 1:1 Career Coaching
- Individual career plan development
- Work readiness training
- Career exploration
- Paid work experience placement and support
- Occupational training
- Job search assistance and placement
- Retention and advancement support after job placement





FY 14-15 Outcomes - Adults

Number of Adults Enrolled	725
Completed WorkSource preparatory services: Resume, interviewing, ESL, etc.	906
Completed occupational training, internships, on- the-job training.	283
Number of individuals exiting program.	406 (56%)
Exited with employment	288 (71%)
Average Wage at exit	\$13.03



Youth Outcomes

1st Cohort of Youth Served: 239 youth

Successfully completed two years of intensive workforce	179 (75%)
development	
Placed in employment or post-secondary education	165
 Participants went on to employment 	127 (76%)
Participants went on to post-secondary education	58 (24%)
Attained a High School Equivalency (GED, HS Diploma)	98 (41%)
Entered the program with low reading and math skills and	68 (29%)
left with an entire grade level increase	
Attained an occupational or professional certificate	20 (8%)
Average wage at program completion	\$10.54/hr

Youth served for approximately three years: FY 12/13 through FY 14/15



Leverage for Youth



The City's investment leverages \$2.4 million in additional investment by Worksystems in:

- <u>Service Coordination</u>: Additional investment in providers including outside of Portland (Gresham, and Washington County)
- <u>Paid internships</u>: centralized employer-of-record, worksite development and youth wages



Leverage for Adults



The adult system **leverages approximately \$1M** in prioritized services and products of the WorkSource system including:

- Workshops: resume writing, interviewing, English as a second language
- Occupational training
- Work experiences and on-the-job training
- Expanded service capacity supported by intensive grants including:
 - HealthCareers NW, and
 - Multnomah County Department of Community Justice program
- Rent assistance for participants at risk of losing housing or homeless
- Matching funds for services to food stamp recipients, expected to commence July 1.
