Purpose of report and background information: The purpose of this report is to review and share with the public the current status and challenges of the \$68 million 2014 Portland Parks & Recreation Replacement Bond Program. Since the inauguration of the Bond, the Bond Team has laid the foundation for a successful parks improvement program, including prioritizing needs, budgeting and planning project scopes, evaluating design proposals, initiating design work, requesting bids from construction contractors, and managing construction work and associated contracts.

The second year of the Bond Program built on the first year's foundational work, with the Bond Team moving several Bond Phase 1 projects forward through design, permitting, construction, and completion. As of July 2017, all 34 Bond Phase 1 project are underway. Eight projects are complete (three of which were condition assessment studies), and significant progress has been made on the remaining 26 projects in Phase 1.

Over the last year, PP&R staff have also completed a significant amount of work to identify and scope the Bond Phase 2 Project List which would utilize the remaining \$20.4 million of the Bond funding. Staff prepared asset and facility assessments and then prioritized those assets and facilities in most critical need of repair. Projects were scoped and costed and then the proposed Phase 2 Project List was circulated in the community to gather public feedback.

Community participation and outreach for Bond Phase 1 projects and for the Bond Phase 2 Project List was extensive and continues to build on previous public outreach efforts. Public outreach, including advisory committees and public meetings, will help ensure that improvements continue to meet the needs and expectations of the community.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

There are no financial or budgetary impacts directly resulting from the presentation of this report.

Community impacts and community involvement:

In 2014, the Portland community voted to support a measure to issue up to \$68 million in general obligation bonds to pay for the capital costs of repairs and improvements to

existing park facilities. The initial Parks Replacement Bond projects identified with community input included repair or replacement of playgrounds, trails and bridges, pools, facilities to protect workers, restrooms and Pioneer Courthouse Square, as well as making accessibility improvements and other urgent repairs.

The initial project list was developed from various sources, including staff-identified needs, policy documents such as *Parks 2020 Vision*, park master plans, technical papers, asset register reports, and input from residents and other public agencies. Potential projects were screened, evaluated, and reviewed against community priorities and system-wide needs.

In Year 2, the Bond Program has attended 40 public meetings, 5 celebration events, posted 136 signs and had 77,012 hits to individual Parks Bond project webpages.
