ORDINANCE No. 188593

*Authorize a grant agreement with CASH Oregon for \$78,786 to provide financial education, counseling and free tax preparation services to low-income families and individuals in Portland (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Whereas, many low-income families and individuals in Portland cannot afford tax preparation services;
- 2. Whereas, many of these families and individuals are not aware of available tax credits; and
- 3. Whereas, CASH Oregon provides financial education, counseling and free tax preparation services to low-income families and individuals at over 20 sites in Portland; and
- 4. This grant funding from the City of Portland is critical to ensure that CASH Oregon will be able to meet the increased demand for these services throughout Portland.
- 5. The FY2017-18 budget includes funding in the General Fund Special Appropriations for the above grant. The City now desires to make a grant to CASH Oregon in an amount not to exceed \$78,786.
- 6. The City's Comprehensive Financial Management Policies, FIN 2.04-Budget, states that grants should be issued after a competitive application process, unless Council waives the policy in the grant ordinance. Since CASH Oregon is the only organization providing these services, a competitive application process was not implemented for this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement, as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$78,786.
- b. The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04-Budget.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver payment chargeable to the Fiscal Year 2017-18 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in funding would delay CASH Oregon's ability to begin hiring staff and initiating their work; therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
