Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

This intergovernmental agreement is being proposed to allow the Multnomah County Health Department Community Capacitation Center Multnomah County to provide consultation and training services and from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019, to PCL staff and grantee programs.

The purpose of these services is to support implementation of trauma-informed, culturally responsive reflective supervision practices as covered in training events. These services build upon the Reflective Supervision Training provided through the previous IGA with the Multnomah County Health Department Community Capacitation Center.

In a public meeting on June 2, 2015, the Allocation Committee of the Children's Levy allocated up to \$500,000 to provide training, technical assistance, and quality improvement services to grantee agencies who provide services to children and their families residing in the City of Portland. The Portland City Council approved this allocation on July 29, 2015 in Ordinance 187274. On December 2, 2015, in Ordinance 187469, Portland City Council approved the allocation of up to \$12,000 of these funds for the IGA with Multnomah County Health Department Community Capacitation Center to provide training to PCL grantee programs. This agreement authorizes the spending of up to \$15,750 of those funds.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

Funds for this intergovernmental agreement are included in the current Portland Children's Levy budget.

Community impacts and community involvement:

This intergovernmental agreement provides training to improve the quality of services provided by nonprofit agencies receiving fund from the Portland Children's Levy. These services are primarily provided for the benefit of ethnically and racially diverse, low-income children and their families who live in the City of Portland.
