Why do we need an enforcement program?



- > Increase in community uses and construction work in the public right-of-way
- > Increase in disregard for permit conditions or work without a valid permit

What is the program objective?

- > Keep people moving
- > Compliance & safety
- > Consistency & transparency
- > Empower staff



How will enforcement actions be determined?

- > Class I, Class II, Class III
- > Based on safety and accommodation for traveling autos, bikes & peds
- > Assessments based on penalty schedule



What is the process and who is responsible?

- 1: Violation discovery & intake
- 2: Inspection
- 3: Compliance & review
- 4: Final determination
- 5: Code Hearings Officer
