WHEREAS, here in our great Oregon Country hundreds of years before the coming of the first white men, roving bands of the Chinookans, the Multnomahs, the Kalapooeyans, the Tillamooks, the Yakonians, the Kusans, the Klamaths and the Modocs, the Palute and the Snake, and other tribes, made their homes, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper that we set aside a day in which to honor the American Indian;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Terry D. Schrunk, Mayor of Portland, Oregon, the "City of Roses", do hereby proclaim October 28, 1961, as

AMERICAN INDIAN DAY

in Portland, and urge our citizens to participate in a salute to our American Indian by attending the POW-WOW to be held at Lloyd Center, in Portland on October 28th.
