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Portland, 10 April 1866.

To the Marshall of the City of Portland, Me.

Sir,

I was called this morning to see a sick Indian in the northern portion of the City, whose symptoms excited in my mind suspicion of Small Pox.

This is but the second day of his illness, and the eruption could not be expected until the third, in such form as to enable a physician positively to diagnose the case.

As a Sanitary measure, I would respectfully suggest that the Marshal give orders, that the case be watched until a positive opinion may be given - say for one or two days. It might also be well to prevent any of the Indians from that portion of the City, coming into the populated portion of its limits.

I regret to have given you any unnecessary trouble, but feel glad to know that our authorities feel disposed promptly to care for the public and private weal.
