 Teen programs are core to PP&R's mission and contribute to a cohesive and supportive community that promotes positive youth development.

#### Financial and budgetary impacts:

The report describes the program - ongoing funding is appropriated; no fiscal or budgetary impact from this action.

#### Community impacts and community involvement:

The Teen Program is connected to the broader community. Teen Program staff regularly attend the bi-weekly Community Peace Collaborative meetings, the Teen Program funds grants to support youth-serving non-profits, and dedicated access to community centers are provided for many groups to bring their youth groups for a safe and engaging space to serve youth.

Council's decision in 2015 to invest in Teen Programs followed a broad community discussion in which Mayor Hales convened groups to consider how the City could play a more effective role connecting youth, service providers, volunteers, events, and shared spaces. This broad community discussion gave rise to partnerships that are going strong today, with groups such as POIC, the Rosewood Initiative, Vanport Mosaic, Latino Network, IRCO, and others.
