An Ordinance amending Section 1-501 of Ordinance No. 77820 (Code of General Provisions) so as to re-describe the city seal to correspond with the original seal.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that on September 16, 1964, the city Council adopted the recommendation of the Commissioner of Finance that the original seal be continued as the official seal of the City of Portland, as described in his report; that pursuant thereto the City Auditor shall obtain a new seal and the description contained in the Code of General Provisions should be amended to correspond thereto; now, therefore, Section 1-501 of Ordinance No. 77820 (Code of General Provisions) passed by the Council September 10, 1942, hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 1-501. DESCRIPTION. The seal of the City of Portland shall be 1 3/4 inches in diameter and is described left to right as follows: Three-masted ship, sails partially unfurled; auxiliary steam stack with smoke extending to the left; river extends from the left side of the seal slightly beyond the lower center; central figure of a woman straight front with face profile looking out on the river; right hand holding three (separate) pronged spear; left hand pointing towards fir forest with Mt. Hood in background; six-pointed star over head of figure; cog wheel and sledge hammer at lower right: sheaf of grain at the right of figure. On the outer rim shall be the words: "City of Portland, Oregon," and the fig-ures "1851." The impression of such seal is shown on a separate sheet filed with the original of this amendatory ordinance only.

ORDINANCE NO. 2184

An Ordinance adopting a seal for the City of Portland.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the seal to be hereafter used and known as the seal of the City of Portland shall consist of a female figure in the center thereof, representing Commerce, and holding in her right hand a trident and pointing with her left to a sheaf of wheat and a forest, with a representation of Mount Hood in the background, and at her feet a cogwheel and hammer, and on her right a steamship coming into port. Said seal shall also have the words "City of Portland, Oregon" in the outer rim thereof, also the figure "1851" the date of the incorporation of the City of Portland, and shall make an impression $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter, as follows:



Section 2. That the seal described in Section one of this Ordinance be and is hereby adopted as the Seal of the City of Portland.

ORDINANCE NO. 119284

An Ordinance transferring \$125 from Budget Contingencies to the Office of the City Auditor for the purchase of a City of Portland seal die, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that in accordance with a report of the Commissioner of Finance a new City of Portland seal was adopted by the Council on Council Calendar No. 3571 September 16, 1964; that said report directed the City Auditor to buy a new engraved die and cast of said seal; that there is no provision within the current budget of the Office of the City Auditor for the purchase of this equipment; that funds may be transferred within the General Fund for this purchase; and that such transfer should be made; now, therefore, the sum of \$125 is hereby transferred within the General Fund from appropriation Budget Contingencies (3830) to the appropriation Office of the City Auditor, Equipment (3700.720) for the engraved die of the new City of Portland Seal.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that there may be no delay in transferring the necessary funds for the die as described in Section 1 of this ordinance; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

ORDINANCE No. 132219

An Ordinance amending Chapter 1.06 of Title 1 of the Code of the City of Portland, Oregon by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 1.06.020 to provide for a change in color requirements for the City flag when it is in miniature size and when it is being displayed outdoors from a pole or staff.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that there has been a negative response to display of the City flag by citizens of the City of Portland and that elimination of the requirements for a canton and seal on the official flag, when it is of miniature size or when displayed outdoors from a pole or staff, would substantially decrease the cost of the flag and thereby hopefully stimulate its use; that this change has been recommended by the Portland Art Commission by and through its Chairman, Richard Norman; that, therefore, Chapter 1.06 of Title 1 of the Code of the City of Portland, Oregon hereby is amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered, entitled and to read as follows:

Chapter 1.06 OFFICIAL FLAG

* * *

Section 1.06.020 Requirements for the Official Flag of the City When Displayed Outdoors from Pole or Staff and for Miniature Flags Wherever Displayed.

(a) When displayed outdoors from a pole or staff, the City flag and miniature copies thereof, wherever displayed, may eliminate the canton of blue and the seal of yellow required in Section 1.06.010, and the green of the remaining field may be substituted for the blue canton and the yellow seal. Except for miniature flags, this exception will not apply to a flag displayed inside a building or used for parade purposes.

(b) Miniature Flag Defined. A miniature flag is not to exceed 9" in length and all proportions in relation to the length must comply with the requirements of Section 1.06.010.
