Dear Friend Biddy:am sending you a telegram today and at the same time a letter to explain when I enlisted they told me in Portland that in order to go to Columbia and enlist in the Chaser service I had to enlist in the regular pary, so I did because I wanted to stay in the gasolen motor game. I hey also told me that there would be plenty of ways of getting out after the war. Gotlowing is paragraph #3 of a letter received by the captain of the 928 in regards to the release of regular Mary men. Referring to reference ( of above in regard to the release of ten percent of regular four year men who enlisted for the first time between april 6, 1917 and January 11, 1968, the request for discharge must be accompanied by one afridavit from a regulable firm or individual, giving the detailed information necessary; the endorsement of the Commanding Officer will make specific recomendation with

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reference to the merits of the case and any in vestagation of facto refereed to in the request and
affidavit.

Suppose the affidavit is merely to show that
there is no brill connected to getting out of
the regular service.

If my request is then accepted I will be transfered
to Bremerton and then discharged and pay my own
fare to Portland.

Carry charges for the affadavit or anything else
will pay to you

of you will do this much for me I will come
touch to Fortland and eat smoke like onever ate it
before. Thanking you very much for your trouble
