# Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The purpose of this legislation is to authorize the Chief Procurement Officer to execute a construction contract for the East Portland Active Transportation to Transit Project in the amount of \$2,515,322.75.

The project will implement pedestrian improvements on SE Division, between 1-205 and 157th and the 130's Neighborhood Greenway between the Springer Corridor Trail and the 1-84 Multi-Use Path.

Ordinance No. 187340 was approved by City Council on September 16, 2015, authorizing the Chief Procurement Officer to issue a competitive solicitation for the East Portland Active Transportation to Transit Project on behalf of Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT). The construction cost based on bids received is \$2,515,322.75.

No revenues will be impacted by this legislation.

This legislation does not change existing City policy.

## Financial and budgetary impacts:

The engineer's estimate for this project was \$3,076,274.36 and the confidence level was optimal. Based on bids received, PBOT anticipates the construction contract cost to be \$2,515,322.75 which is 18.23% below the engineer's estimate.

Funds are available in PBOT T000383.

No present positions will be created, eliminated, or re-classified as a result of this legislation.

## Community impacts and community involvement:

The construction contracting community, including State of Oregon COBID certified contractors as Disadvantaged, Minority, Women owned, Emerging Small Businesses, or Service Disabled Veteran owned businesses became involved when the Chief Procurement Officer advertised and publicly noticed the project on the City's Online Procurement System on October 08, 2018.

Potential bidders were able to review the competitive solicitation, attend a pre-bid meeting, ask questions, provide comments, and submit a bid in response to the Invitation to Bid (ITB). Bids received resulted in the award of the construction contract. Procurement Services managed the procurement process. No protests were received.
