Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

These appointments will fill positions on the Floating Structures Code Board of Appeal as required by Portland City Code Title 28. There are still open positions open on the Board; 1 member and 2 alternate positions.

The Board appointments are citizen-volunteer positions, so no revenue or expenses are incurred by these positions.

Community impacts and community involvement:

There has been active on-going recruitment for members of the Floating Structures Code Board of Appeal. Current Board members notified their constituent groups of the vacant positions, and BDS has distributed vacancy notices through flyers. Once CCL receives the applications and conflict of interest forms, it forwards those documents to Terry Whitehill in BDS for review.

Martha Bailey – Martha has an ongoing interest in floating structures; she was on the River Community Advisory Committee for 6 years and was on the Title 28 Citizens Update Committee.

David Grant - David has over 30-years of experience in floating home construction. He is a member of the original Title 28 Citizens Update Committee and has been a chairperson for the River Community Advisory Committee. He is also a member of the Scappoose Fire Department Board.

Stan Tonneson - Stan has owned a 56-floating home marina for 12 years and is a member of Waterfront Owners and Operators of Oregon (WOOO).
