ORDINANCE No. 189453

*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University to conduct research on the Emergency Transportation Routes not to exceed \$15,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Natural disasters can happen anytime, and the transportation system needs to be prepared to provide needed transport for fuel, essential supplies and medical transport, during and after any emergency. The Regional Disaster Preparedness Organization (RDPO) and Metro will be updating the existing Emergency Transportation Routes (ETRs) and Memorandum of Understanding for the five-county Portland-Vancouver metropolitan region.
- 2. This IGA will fund the research of (1) best practices in ETR management, and (2) the policy framework in which the ETRs currently operate in the Portland-Vancouver metropolitan region. This project will provide foundational knowledge for the implementation of the Regional ETR update project led by RDPO and Metro.
- 3. The City desires to contract with PSU, which has the capacity to perform research concerning best practices in ETR management and policy, through a Project Manager, who will supervise a PSU graduate student.
- 4. ORS 190.010 to 190.030 authorizes units of local government in the state of Oregon to enter into written agreements with any other unit or units of local government for the performance of any or all functions and activities that any of them has the authority to perform.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management is hereby authorized to enter into this IGA in a form substantially similar to Exhibit D.
- b. The Director of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications to the IGA provided such modifications that increase financial obligation to the City have available budgetary appropriations.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the UASI 18 agreement between the City and the State indicates we will develop ETR criteria by the fourth month of the agreement, the PSU work is a necessary precursor to meet the agreed on milestones; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
