## RESOLUTION No. 37428-

Accept the Build Portland 2019 Annual Update presentation and commend the multibureau partnership for advancing the Phase I projects in a timely and fiscally responsible manner (Resolution)

WHEREAS, the City owns and manages over \$35.9 Billion in assets, representing generations of investment by Portlanders and the City faces challenges maintaining the infrastructure that provides core city services; and

WHEREAS, the City's 'infrastructure gap' represents a significant long-term liability for the City and will deprive future residents of the services that make Portland a livable city; and

WHEREAS, in the FY 2017-18 Proposed Budget the Mayor announced a bold infrastructure plan, "Build Portland," with a goal of spending \$600 Million of City resources by 2040 to make critical reinvestments in our core infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, on October 11, 2017, via Resolution 37322, the City of Portland declared its intent to be a leader in facing the challenges of crumbling infrastructure and deferred maintenance and City Council directed the Office of Management and Finance (OMF) to establish a Build Portland Advisory Committee and develop a funding plan for infrastructure maintenance; and

WHEREAS, on March 28, 2018, via Resolution 37349, City Council directed the Chief Administrative Officer, the Chief Financial Officer, and the directors of the City Budget Office, the Portland Bureau of Transportation, and Portland Parks & Recreation to proceed with the prioritized list of seven Build Portland Projects; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2018, via Ordinance 188885, City Council authorized limited tax revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$52 Million to finance infrastructure improvements in City parks and transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Portland Bureau of Transportation and Portland Parks and Recreation have initiated the Phase I projects and are on-track to meet expected 2020 project phase projections; and

WHEREAS, Build Portland has program administration costs and the Mayor's Proposed Budget directs the City Budget Office to transfer \$100,000 in the FY 2019-20 Fall Supplemental from the Build Portland Current Appropriation Level (CAL) to the Office of Management and Finance, and to do so on an ongoing basis to fund Build Portland program administration and service costs within OMF.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, City Council accepts the Build Portland 2019 Annual Update presentation and commends the multi-bureau partnership the multibureau partnership for advancing the Phase I projects in a timely and fiscally responsible manner.
