ORDINANCE No. 189568

Authorize grant agreement to award up to \$73,000 in FY 19/20 to Southwest Neighborhoods, Inc. to provide outreach, technical assistance and community involvement for watershed projects in Portland's westside sub-watersheds (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. On March 8, 2006, the Council adopted the 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan (PWMP), which describes actions for watershed health including citizen-led activities such as stormwater management, revegetation, education, and stewardship.
- 2. Much of the success of the PWMP relies on the extent of citizen and community participation. Southwest Neighborhoods, Inc. (SWNI) is a neighborhood coalition that provides information, education and technical assistance to residents in SW Portland.
- 3. The Bureau of Environmental Services' (BES) 10-year Strategic Plan (2018-2027) guides the bureau's work and provides a structure for evaluating and improving service delivery for all Portlanders. Building strong community relationships is identified as one of the six goal areas for the bureau to pursue over the next decade.
- 4. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) has been successfully partnering with SWNI since 1999 to provide watershed education at the SW Watershed Resource Center and since 2001 to involve citizens in watershed project implementation.
- 5. BES seeks to continue its partnership with SWNI by funding SWNI's efforts in capacitybuilding, project development, education, outreach, and engagement, and program administration related to stormwater management, water quality protection, pollution prevention, erosion control, invasive plant removal, and native plant landscaping.
- 6. The established cost is \$73,000. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2019/20 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services; Cost Object ESWS000009.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute this grant a. agreement and amendments that do not increase the grant amount.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the contract from the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority, provided the sum of such warrants does not exceed \$73,000.
