

Portland Building Follow-up:

Greater public transparency needed about project costs, trade-offs, and missed equity requirement

The Portland Building is an active construction site and the renovation is forecasted to be completed ahead of schedule. We identified risk areas during the project's initial phase, and this report follows up on the recommendations from that 2016 audit. We found these issues have not been resolved.

The opportunity to revisit decisions has passed, but the audit includes recommendations for the remainder of the City's work on the Portland Building. These recommendations include transparency about collective renovation costs, compliance actions still needed, and implementation of the community benefits.
