

ORDINANCE No. 189639

\*Authorize an agreement with Southeast Uplift Neighborhood Program Inc. to hire an independent contractor to manage the Portland United Against Hate program and coalition in an amount not to exceed \$36,538 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Portland United Against Hate is a 70+member coalition of community organizations, neighborhood groups, and municipal bodies with a mission to track, respond to, and prevent acts of hate, while providing the support that communities need.
2. The goals of PUAH are (1) to decrease the impact of hate violence on communities, support healing, and promote prevention and (2) to provide valuable data and insights into the community's needs and interests, allowing Bureaus and City Council to make more informed service and communication decisions. In addition, the program provides support and referrals to vulnerable community members, including culturally-appropriate advocacy, legal, and mental health services.
3. PUAH leadership have negotiated the transition of fiscal management of the Coalition from the Office of Community & Civic Life to SE Uplift. SE Uplift has been a leader in the PUAH Coalition and offers an important link to neighborhoods, local organizations and City infrastructure.
4. Having a community-facing organization provide this role will enable PUAH to seek partnerships outside of the City, including independent funding sources.
5. These funds will be used to support PUAH's organizational infrastructure and hire an independent contractor to manage the coalition's day-to-day operations, while continuing the data gathering, rapid response, and training programmatic work of the coalition.
6. The FY2019-20 budget includes funding in the General Fund Special Appropriations for the above grant. The City now desires to make a grant to SE Uplift in an amount not to exceed \$36,538.
7. The City's Comprehensive Financial Management Policies, FIN 2.04-Budget, states that grants should be issued after a competitive application process, unless Council waives the policy in the grant ordinance. These funds were allocated for this purpose as a Special Appropriation and approved by Council in the FY2019-20 Approved Budget.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is authorized to execute a grant agreement in a form similar to the agreement attached as Exhibit A in an amount not to exceed \$36,538.
- b. The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04-Budget.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver payment chargeable to the Fiscal Year 2019-20 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in funding would delay Portland United Against Hate's ability to meet the coalition's hiring goals for the first quarter for FY2019-20; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
