An Ordinance to prevent ~~the making of~~  
Chinese being employed on city contracts.

The City of Porttuna does ordain  
as follows:

Section 1. That hereafter no Chinese  
labor shall be employed on any work  
done under contract from the City.

Sec. 2. That in all contracts ~~hereafter~~<sup>hereafter</sup>  
let by the City for ~~improvement~~ <sup>the</sup>  
performance of any work that there  
be inserted substantially, the following  
clause: "and it is agreed and  
stipulated by and between the parties  
hereto that no ~~Chinese~~ ~~Chinese~~ Chinese  
or Chinese shall be employed in any  
manner upon the said work, and  
in case of a violation of this provision  
all work done upon this contract  
shall be forfeited to the City and  
this contract shall be annulled."

~~Sec 2. This ordinance shall take effect~~
