

An ordinance for the suppression of Gambling & Gaming -

- 1 The People of the City of Pullman do ordain as follows - All wicket tables faro banks and all gambling with Cards, gaming tables or gambling devices whatever are hereby prohibited from being set up, or used for gaming or gambling purposes within the City limits.
- sec 2 Every person who shall bet any money or other property at or on any gambling table, bank or gambling device prohibited by ~~the~~ ^{this} ordinance shall on conviction ^{thereof} before the recorder be punished by fine not exceeding \$ 50⁰⁰ nor less than \$ 5⁰⁰, the amt so collected to be paid into the City Treasury
- sec 3 Every person who shall suffer any gambling table bank or gambling device prohibited by sec one of this ordinance to be set up or used for the purpose of gaming, in any house building ~~structure~~ yard garden or lot to him belonging or by him occupied or of which he has the control, shall on conviction of the same before the recorder be fined in the sum of not more than \$ 100⁰⁰ nor less than \$ 20⁰⁰, the amt so collected to be paid into the City Treasury

"Ordinance No. 2"

An Ordinance for the suppression of gambling and gaming.

Section 1st — The people of the City of Portland do ordain as follows: — All roulette tables, game banks, and all gambling with Cards, gaming tables or gambling devices whatever are hereby prohibited from being set up or used for gaming or gambling purposes within the City limits.

Section 2nd — Every person who shall bet any money or ~~other~~ property at or on any gambling table, bank or gambling device prohibited by section one of this Ordinance shall on conviction thereof before the recorder be punished by fine not exceeding \$50.⁰⁰ nor less than \$5.⁰⁰, the amount so collected to be paid into the City Treasury.

Section 3rd — Every person who shall suffer any gambling table bank or gambling device prohibited by section one of this Ordinance to be set up or used for the purpose of gaming, in any house building, yard garden or lot to him belonging or by him occupied, or of which he has the Control, shall on conviction of the same before the recorder be fined in the sum of not more than \$100.⁰⁰ nor less than \$20.⁰⁰ the amount so collected to be paid into the City Treasury.

Section 4th — This Ordinance to take effect and be in force from, and after, its approval by the Mayor.

Ordinance No. 2

The people of the city of Portland
do ordain as follows

Sect 1 All persons who shall be found betting
at any game of hazzard skill or chance
within the limits of this city shall be immediately
arrested by the Marshall on notice being given him
thereof they shall be brought before the Recorder
and on evidence of their guilt fined by ~~the~~ Recorder
in the penalty of \$25 for the first offence
\$50 for the second and \$100 for each and every
subsequent offence to be by the Marshall
collected ^{of them} before they are discharged from his
custody

Sect 2 The owner or occupant of any house building
or tenement in this city in which any gambling
shall be permitted by and with such owner or
occupants knowledge and consent shall on proof
of said gambling be subjected to the same
penalties for each and every offence as provided
in the preceding section of this ordinance for
the participants in said gambling

Sect 3 All moneys collected by the Marshall under the provisions
of this ordinance shall at the end of each & every month
be paid by him to the city Treasurer he first deducting
from the same the necessary expenses of their collection
& reporting the amount to the council
