



At the end of every audit report, we issue a series of recommendations intended to make programs work even better.










Cleanups of Homeless Camps: Improved communications and data needed

The City's Homelessness/Urban Camping Impact Reduction Program addressed some of the recommendations to improve its response to people living in tents and makeshift shelters on City property. The program takes complaints, assesses campsites, and removes trash, but some cleanups displace people from their belongings. Our 2019 audit found that this program has had some success, but needed to improve public information, data collection and analysis, and internal policies.

In the year since our audit, the program has improved how it takes care of people's property and began building a web application to better manage and track its work. The program also changed its services in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.





Data Notes

We designed this dashboard to inform the public about the status of audit recommendations. We've prepared it with a few audiences in mind:

City Council can use it to identify bureaus that may need additional resources or support in order to implement audit recommendations.

General public can use it to monitor the status of recommendations related to topics of interest and to compare performance across bureaus.

Bureau management and staff can use it to track recommendation status across audits to develop work plans and priorities.

Bureau Directors can use it to assess bureau performance and to determine if any changes in policy or procedure are necessary.

Recommendation Status

Implemented: fully implemented by the bureau

In Process: bureaus are on their way to implementation

Slow Progress: bureaus committed to implementation, but have not made much progress

Not Implemented: bureaus are not intending to implement

Pending: new recommendation and auditors have not followed up yet

This report only includes the status of recommendation from audits produced since 2018, which was the beginning of our new follow-up process. We will continue to keep track of recommendations for 10 years.

We track the four functions performed by the Office of Management and Finance separately despite the fact that they all report to the Chief Administrative Officer. These functions are the Office of the Chief Administrative Officer which includes facilities management, fleet management, and programs to address homelessness; the Bureau of Human Resources; the Bureau of Revenue and Financial Services; and the Bureau of Technology Services.
