Gentlemen

The Undersigned petitioners
do hereby most respectfully show to Your
Honorable Body That the County of Multno-
mah is now erecting a large and substantial
Armory for Military purposes on the South
Half of Block 69 in Couchs Addition to the
City of Portland

That said Armory on its South and West
and East Walls is 18 inches from "C" St 10th and
N. 9th Streets respectively thus practically widening
these streets to that extent

That said Armory as shown by the accompa-
nying sketch has Bastioned Towers at its
South East and North West corners, which Towers
are necessary and indispensable to such
a building

That said Tower on the South East Corner
of said building will for a length of about
Six (6) feet on each street project about Two (2)
feet into "C" Street and N 9th Street
and said Tower on the N.W. Corner of
said building will necessarily extend for a

length of about 6 ft. about Two (2) feet into
N 10th Street

That said space of Six feet in length and
Two feet in width taken up by said Towers
on N 9th St ~~main~~ and C St are all
within the angle and a few feet from
the Corner of said Streets and neither this
or the space taken on N 10th St will in
any way impede travel upon, or obstruct
said Streets

Wherefore your petitioners pray leave
^{for said County} to so construct said building and to
occupy so much of said Streets therefor
as is herein before specified




