And still we can't get the viewpoint of the man who regards a venereal disease a "private disease" whose sufferers must screened religiously and afforded every opportunity to communicate their curse to others. It is the viewpoint of the enemy of society-nothing less.

## AFTER VENEREAL DISEASE

City Council Expected to Pass Ordinance Tonight.

The city council will this evening again take up the ordinance for the prevention of venereal diseases, and now that the committee on health man king's ordinance it is expected

The ordinance is not just as the sovernment plan provides, but is just as drastic and better adapted to local conditions. It provides that garded as communicable, infectuous, sovern its spread provides that:

First—The board of health shall

have power to isolate and quarantine all cases deemed dangerous to public health.

Second—All physicians must report within forty-eight hours any der their knowledge

der their knowledge.

Third—All druggists must report sales of medicines and prescriptions are forbidden to sell any of these of person for whom the articles are being purchased.

Fourth—Therecords of these reports are to be kept by the board of health and will not be open to public Fifth—A penalty of a fine not over \$300 and jail sentence not over ninety

\$300 and jail sentence not over days, or both, is provided for persons those who fail to make reports and for druggists or doctors.
