ORDINANCE No. 190075

*Authorize application to National Association of City Transportation Officials for a grant in the amount of \$25,000 to support response to COVID-19 through right-of-way transformation to support businesses in the Albina area in partnership with the Soul District Business Association, Self Enhancement Inc., and the Albina Vision Trust (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- NACTO Streets for Pandemic Response and Recovery grant program provides funding to implement Healthy Business projects and to fund community-based organizations to design and program those projects.
- The Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) has launched the COVID-19
 Frontline Communities Partnership Program to engage Black, Indigenous and
 People of Color in the Bureau's COVID response efforts.
- PBOT is implementing the Safe Streets Initiative but small businesses have struggled to identify capital or organizing capacity to participate in PBOT's Healthy Businesses program, which permits them to repurpose portions of sidewalks, parking spaces, or streets for physical distancing.
- The Soul District Business Association, Self Enhancement Inc., and the Albina Vision Trust have expressed interest in partnering with PBOT on this program.
- The grant does not require matching funds.
- 6. The City of Portland, Bureau of Transportation will submit the following \$25,000 grant application: An application to fund community partners to lead engagement and design of ROW use for business activity to support physical distancing, design of public art and branding in the ROW, and to purchase traffic control devices and other installation materials in the Albina Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to make application to the NACTO for a grant in the amount of \$25,000.
- The Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for

reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Commissioner-in-Charge's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the applications are due July 10, 2020; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
