

An Ordinance authorizing application by the Bureau of Parks to the Oregon State Marine Board for a grant estimated at \$10,240 for construction of three information kiosks at Cathedral Park, Willamette Park, and NE 43rd and Marine Drive, authorizing a contract and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Oregon State Marine Board makes grants to local governments for the construction and maintenance of boating facilities and related projects.
2. Three boat launching facilities in Portland require information kiosks that will provide boating, water safety, and educational information to the public.
3. The grant application will request funds in the amount of \$10,240 for construction of these kiosks. Full indirect costs at a rate of 17 percent are included in the grant budget. No local match is required.
4. The kiosk at NE 43rd and Marine Drive will be installed and maintained by Multnomah County; the kiosks in Cathedral and Willamette Parks will be installed and maintained by the Portland Park Bureau.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and Commissioner in charge shall make application to the Oregon State Marine Board for a grant estimated at \$10,240 for information kiosks at Cathedral and Willamette Parks, and the 43rd Street boat ramp.
- b. Should the described grant be approved, a contract or grant agreement is authorized.
- c. The Commissioner in charge is authorized to provide assurances regarding the use of the grant as may be required by the Oregon State Marine Board.
- d. The Commissioner in charge is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for receipt, expenditure and accounting for the grant project.


