Existing Action Item R11D

R11D: The City of Portland, to address river recreational safety and ecological health of the river, will petition the Oregon State Marine Board to establish a Slow/No Wake Zone between the Hawthorne and the Sellwood Bridges and at Powers Marine Park and Elk Rock Island.

Replacement Action Item R11D

R11D: The City of Portland will monitor the implementation of the Oregon State Marine Board's rules for the South Reach, participate in the Board's evaluation process, and report to City Council in 2024 with recommendations, if any, for further action.
