



## **Watershed Health and Resilience**

### Potential Discussion Questions

1. The River Plan / South Reach updates regulations for highly-valued natural resources, including the river and riverbank, tree canopy, special status species, etc., and floodplains. Are there other natural resource protections we should consider, such as culturally-significant species or others?
2. What are the priority restoration opportunities in the South Reach? Are there specific species you think should be prioritized?



## **Recreation**

### Potential Discussion Questions

1. Where do you spend your free time in the South Reach (parks, trails and natural areas)?  
What do you enjoy doing?
2. Are there improvements you would like to see made for in-river or on-land activities?



## **Tribal and Urban Native Community Engagement**

### Potential Discussion Questions

1. Is it a good idea for the City to identify culturally-significant plants in parks and open spaces?
2. What recommendations do you have for a potential South Reach first food program? What are the key components of such a program? Are there concerns or pitfalls we should know about?
3. Have we identified the general areas in the South Reach where there might be cultural resources?
4. What should the City be thinking about as it revises its inadvertent discovery processes?



## **Riverfront Communities**

### Potential Discussion Questions

1. How do you get to the riverfront and/or into the river in the South Reach?
2. Do you have ideas or thoughts about how people and nearby neighborhoods interact with the river/riverfront area in the South Reach?
