ORDINANCE No. 149569

An Ordinance changing the name of the street lying between the northeasterly line of NW Barnes Road and the southeasterly line of NW Seblar Drive from NW Irving Avenue to NW Pittock Avenue, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. A petition has been filed by all six property owners residing on NW Irving Avenue lying between the northeasterly line of NW Barnes Road and the southeasterly line of NW Seblar Drive to change the name of said street to NW Pittock Avenue.
2. The reasons given for the requested name change are difficulties in mail delivery and problems with the Elections Board in assigning precincts.
3. The Park Bureau and the Pittock Mansion Advisory Commission were notified of the proposed name change and had no objection.
4. The request is reasonable and appropriate and the City Engineer recommends the name of the street be changed as requested.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:


- a. The street lying between the northeasterly line of NW Barnes Road and the southeasterly line of NW Seblar Drive is changed to NW Pittock Avenue.
- b. Nothing contained herein shall in any way affect any proceeding, City or otherwise, and such proceeding shall continue and be completed as though the name of the street had not been changed.


