### URDINANCE NO. 149593

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Portland Rose Festival Association to place overhead decorations within the street area of NE Union Avenue between Weidler and Burnside Streets, and NE Sandy Boulevard between 37th and 47th Avenues, from May 24th through June 22nd, 1980, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds;

- 1. The Portland Rose Festival Association, through Clayton Hannon, Executive Manager, has applied for permission to attach decorations on supporting overhead cables across NE Union Avenue between Weidler and Burnside Streets, and to cross NE Sandy Boulevard between 37th and 47th Avenues, from May 24th through June 22nd, 1980.
- 2. That said banners are traditional part of the Rose Festival events and should be continued.
- 3. That the granting of said permission under certain conditions, will not be detrimental to the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. A revocable permit is granted to Portland Rose Festival Association to place overhead decorations across NE Union Avenue between Weidler and Burnside Streets, and across Sandy Boulevard between 37th and 47th Avenues from May 24th through June 22nd, 1980, subject to the following conditions:
  - All decorations must have a clearance of 18 feet above the roadway of the street and 10 feet above the sidewalk and comply with State Highway regulations govering such installations.
  - (2) Approval for use of utility poles and manner of securing and fastening overhead cables to the poles must be obtained from the utility companies involved.
  - (3) This permit is for the use of the street area only and shall not exempt the grantee from obtaining any license or permit required by City Code or Ordinance for any act to be performed under this permit, nor shall this permit waive the provision of any City Code or Ordinance or the City Charter except as herein stated.

# ORDINANCE No.

- (4) This permit is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Council no expenditure of money or lapse of time or other act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland, or be held to give the grantee any vested or other right.
- (5) The grantee shall hold the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees free and harmless from any claims for damages to persons or property, including legal fees and costs of defending any actions or suits, including any appeals which may result from the use of the street area under this permit by providing evidence of insurance protecting the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees as follows: Bodily injury \$100,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, property damage \$50,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, said insurance to be kept in full force and effect at all times. This permit

is automatically revoked without further action by the Council if this insurance is permitted to lapse, is cancelled or, for any other reason, becomes inoperative.

- Section 2. This Ordinance will not become effective until the grantee has filed with the City Auditor both a document accepting the terms and conditions hereof, and the evidence of insurance, each of which has been approved by the City Attorney.
- Section 3. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in the enactment of this Ordinance will result in an unnecessary hardship of uncertainty on the part of the applicant as to the status of the requested permit for banners and decorations; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage.
