ORDINANCE NO. 149594

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to the Portland Rose Festival Association to close portions of NE Occident Avenue and NE 2nd Avenue, prior to the Grand Floral Parade, from 4:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 14, 1980, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Portland Rose Festival Association, through Clayton W. Hannon, Executive Manager, has requested permission to close NE Occident Avenue from the north line of NE Oregon Street to the south line of NE Holladay Street and from the north line of NE Holladay Street to the south line of NE Hassalo Street and also NE 2nd Avenue from the north line of NE Holladay Street to the south line of NE Hassalo Street from 4:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., Saturday, June 14, 1980.
2. Said street areas are needed to provide for an equestrian staging area prior to the Grand Floral Parade.
3. That the granting of said permission, under certain conditions, will not be detrimental to the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. A revocable permit hereby is granted to the Portland Rose Festival Association, grantee, to close NE Occident Avenue from the north line of NE Oregon Street to the south line of NE Holladay and from the north line of NE Holladay Street to the south line of NE Hassalo Street and also NE 2nd Avenue from the north line of NE Holladay Street to the south line of NE Hassalo Street from 4:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 14, 1980, subject to the following conditions:
 - (1) This permit is for use of the street area only and shall not exempt the grantee from obtaining any license or permit required by the City Code or Ordinances or any act to be performed under this permit, nor shall this permit waive the provisions of any City Code, Ordinance, or the City Charter, except as herein stated.
 - (2) This permit is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Council and no expenditure of money or lapse of time or other act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland or be held to give the grantee any vested or other right.



- (3) The grantee shall hold the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees free and harmless from any claims for damages to persons or property, including legal fees and costs of defending any actions or suits, including any appeals which may result from the use of the street area under this permit by providing evidence of insurance protecting the City of Portland, its officers, agents, and employees as follows:
 Bodily injury \$100,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, property damage \$50,000 for one claimant and \$300,000 for one occurrence, said insurance to be kept in full force and effect at all times. This permit is automatically revoked without further action by the Council if this insurance is permitted to lapse, is cancelled or, for any other reason, becomes inoperative.
- (4) Written approval has been obtained from abutting property owners along the streets to be closed that they do not object to the requested closures.


Section 2. This Ordinance will not become effective until the grantee has filed with the City Auditor both a document accepting the terms and conditions hereof, and the evidence of insurance, each of which has been approved by the City Attorney.

Section 3. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in the enactment of this Ordinance will result in an unnecessary hardship of uncertainty on the part of the applicant as to the status of the requested permit for temporary closure of portions of NE Occident and 2nd Avenues; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
