ORDINANCE NO.

149809

An Ordinance authorizing an application to the State Office of Elderly Affairs for a grant in the amount now estimated to be \$2,319,951 to provide services for the elderly under the Area Agency on Aging, Human Resources Bureau, AU 380, for the period July 1, 1980, through June 30, 1981, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Pursuant to Resolution No. 31412 and Ordinance No. 139879, the responsibility for the Area Agency on Aging was delegated to the Human Resources Bureau, and funds were received from the State Office of Elderly Affairs to plan, administer and coordinate programs serving elderly residents in the City of Portland and County of Multnomah.
2. Funds are available from the Office of Elderly Affairs to continue providing services under the Area Agency on Aging for the period July 1, 1980, through June 30, 1981, in the amount now estimated at \$2,319,951.
3. Of the total amount anticipated, funds will be received from four sources: Oregon Project Independence, \$521,324; Older Americans Act, as amended, Title III-B, \$844,519, Title III-C-1, \$538,976, and Title III-C-2, \$415,132.
4. Local match for this grant in the amount of \$248,331 will be provided by City/County General Funds and the required match from the Contractors.
5. Indirect costs are included at the rate of seven percent (7%) against allowable costs in the amount of \$6,656.
6. It is therefore appropriate for the Mayor and the Auditor to submit, on behalf of the City, a grant application to the State Office of Elderly Affairs in an amount now estimated to be \$2,319,951 to continue services for the period July 1, 1980, through June 30, 1981, similar in form to Exhibit "A".

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and the Auditor are hereby authorized to submit, on behalf of the City, a grant application to the State Office of Elderly Affairs in an amount now estimated to be \$2,319,951 to continue services for the period July 1, 1980, through June 30, 1981, similar in form to Exhibit "A".
- b. The Mayor and the Auditor are additionally authorized to provide the State Office of Elderly Affairs with such assurances and information as may be required for application and orderly management of the grant.

## ORDINANCE No.

- c. Expenditures under this grant are not authorized until the State Office of Elderly Affairs has approved the grant; the Council has specifically appropriated the funds; and the system of accountability has been established by the Bureau of Financial Affairs.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in enactment of this Ordinance shall result in the loss of opportunity to receive the grant, thereby keeping needed services from the elderly; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
