A. Brief Project Description

The Bilalian African American Martial Arts Club of Oregon, Inc., is a non-profit social service organization, formed in 1980, incorporated in 1981. The organization was formed through the cooperative efforts of Ali M. Muhammad and Na'im Hasan, Master instructor and senior student instructor, respectively.

Located in the Northeast Portland area, the Martial Arts Club provides a safe, supportive, positive, well structured, supervised, and constructive environment to meet both cultural and development needs of young people. The Organization draws youth from diverse socio-economic backgrounds, primarily from lower income family groups.

Our goal is to attract 25-30 young people, from this group that show a willingness and a burning desire to achieve high goals in life, but because of circumstance, did not have a vehicle to obtain such levels. Our intent is not to discriminate through the participant selection processes, but to make our services and teaching matter available to all that are willing to learn and practice discipline, determination, dedication, persistency, consistency, and patience.

Upon completion of the budget period students will have developed and comprehend the following objectives:

- 1) Fundamental Principles of Martials Arts.
- Physical and Mental Coordination displayed through a sequence of patterns.
- 3) Basic Self-Defense Skills for practical application.
- 4) Balance, Timing, and Self-Control.
- 5) Self-Confidence and a Positive Mental Attitude about self and others.

Upon completion of the prescribed budget period we will host a community festival, to be held at Matt Dishman Community Center, 77 NE Knott St., where the skill levels that have been achieved by the students can be properly demonstrated.

We feel that students in our program build better self-images through interpersonal relationships with other students in the program and throughout the community. Students that have participated in our program have showed remarkable improvements in their school work and study habits, family relations, community activities. These kinds of results are do to the fact that the students are taught that they are special people, who can become great individuals if they only believe and have faith in God and their own God given talents.

We also believe that if our services could be provided to students at no cost, more emphasis relative to time and energy could be donated to students collectively and individually. Our desire is to give students the information and direction needed to develop their human potential to the maximum heights achievable.

Today I spoke with the person who had offered to sponsor the Bilalian Martial Arts Club, and found out that his organization does not have the required 501 (c) (3) status. Thus, I would appreciate it very much if you could poll your board members as to their willingness to act as sponsor. (I have to send the other MultiArts contracts down tomorrow to Commissioner Schwab's office, and will send this one down with the next batch in a week or two, so there is not such a rush.)

I'm enclosing information on the Martial Arts Club which is taken from their application. The MultiArts Steering Committee felt strongly that the Club has had a significant and positive influence on the African-American community, and members spoke most highly of Mr. Ali and his partner.

The Club's address is 5514 NE 16th (at Killingsworth) and the phone number there is 288-2663. The Club has received a MultiArts grant in the amount of \$2700, and plans to use the funds for salaries, rent and utilities, office supplies and production costs. The contract would be between your organization (as sponsor) and the City of Portland. As I mentioned to you, I would not anticipate that there would be an inordinate amount of paperwork involved perhaps two or three invoices.
