*Authorize Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County Health Department and Portland Fire & Rescue to conduct COVID-19 Testing and Vaccinations (Ordinance)

Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

This is an Intergovernmental Agreement between Portland Fire & Rescue, through their Community Health Assessment Team (CHAT), and Multnomah County to provide COVID-19 testing and vaccinations.

COVID-19 Testing will identify cases of COVID-19, increase contact tracing of the virus, and permit informed containment to prevent further spread.

The COVID-19 Vaccine is a tool to reduce the severity of illness from COVID-19.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

Multnomah County will provide reimbursement to PF&R for staffing costs, supplies and services related to COVID-19 vaccinations.

Portland Fire & Rescue will create invoices for supplies, services, regular and overtime costs associated with the Vaccination Program.

No additional FTE are required for this work.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Multnomah County Public Health and the PF&R/CHAT Site Testing and Vaccination program will provide localized, drive-through, or site specific COVID-19 testing and vaccinations through mobilized testing/vaccination teams.

The program will be implemented in specific locations, identified by Multnomah County Public Health throughout the City of Portland to ensure that community members more severely or disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 have access (including non-English language) to testing.

Residents most impacted by COVID-19 will have localized access to testing and vaccinations. This program will help identify COVID-19 in Portland's most vulnerable community members, particularly groups that are at a higher risk for or disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.

These groups include but are not limited to those living or working in congregate care or group living facilities, underserved and marginalized populations - including racial and ethnic minority groups, essential frontline workers - including those providing healthcare services and those serving the public, and those 60 years of age or old and/or with underlying health conditions.
