Proposed Amendment to Bureau of Fire and Police Disability and Retirement Administrative Rules

The Bureau of Fire and Police Disability and Retirement (FPDR) proposes amendments to Section 5.4 and Section 5.14 of the FPDR Administrative Rules pertaining to:

- Final Pay (27 Pay Period) – to comply with Ordinance No. 188016, passed by Council on October 6, 2016, Ordinance No. 188089, passed by Council on November 17, 2016 and Ordinance No. 190092 passed by Council on August 12, 2020.
- Tax Offset Benefit – to comply with Ordinance No. 188053, passed by Council on October 26, 2016.
