Note: The attached Rider A, Purchase Option, initialled by both parties, is hereby incorporated into and shall form a part of this Agreement.

1. This Agreement shall be effective upon execution by a duly authorized representative of Lessor and shall commence as to any item of Equipment on the date that item is installed by Lessor ready for use (or in the event that Lessee is not prepared to have the Equipment installed, upon delivery to the installation site) and shall continue in force as to that item for a minimum term of 36 months from that date. Thereafter use of that item of Equipment will be extended or discontinued as provided in the Schedule of Terms.
2. Maintenance service for the Equipment shall be provided under an Equipment Maintenance Agreement between Lessee and Lessor. Basic Maintenance Service, as provided for in the Maintenance Agreement, is included in the Monthly Lease Charge.

ORDINANCE No. 151586

An Ordinance authorizing a lease agreement with ITT Courier Terminal Systems, Inc., for the use of a computer terminal by the Bureau of Police, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The computer terminals available from ITT Courier Terminal Systems, Inc., offer functions which significantly improve the operation of the CRISS system.
2. The Bureau of Computer Services has recommended that all CRISS system terminals use the Courier terminals.
3. Using only terminals from one vendor, i.e., Courier, simplifies the operation and administration of CRISS.
4. The monthly lease cost of the Courier terminals is significantly cheaper than the compatible terminals available from the computer system manufacturer.
5. Funds are available for this terminal in the FY 80-81 budget for the Bureau of Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:


- a. The Commissioner of Public Safety and Auditor are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with ITT Courier Terminal Systems, Inc., for use of a computer terminal by the Bureau of Police, commencing upon delivery of the terminal (approximately June 1, 1981) and extending for a period of thirty-six months: said agreement shall be attached to the original only of this ordinance.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the General Fund, Bureau of Police, AU 100, RU 108, North Precinct, Object Code 230, when demand is presented and approved by the proper authorities.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with this lease will deprive the Bureau of Police of the advantages of this new equipment; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

ORDINANCE No. 151587

An Ordinance authorizing the Purchasing Agent to call for bids to construct the "Lownsdale Square Restroom Reconstruction" project for the Bureau of Facilities Management, authorizing a contract, authorizing the drawing and delivery of warrants, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. It is necessary to reconstruct the men's restroom in Lownsdale Square that was demolished by an explosion on April 23, 1980.
2. Ordinance No. 151353 transferred funds in the amount of \$70,000 from the General Fund Operating Contingency to the FY 1980-81 budget of the Bureau of Facilities Management for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Purchasing Agent shall advertise for bids using specifications filed in his office and, in the event that no satisfactory bid is received, shall readvertise on the same basic specification until a satisfactory bid is received.
- b. A contract is authorized with the most favorable bidder as designated by Council.
- c. The Mayor and the Auditor hereby are authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the FY 1980-81 budget, Bureau of Facilities Management, Capital Improvements, (BUC 34901198/5015/630), when demand is presented and approved by the proper authorities.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with the construction project may result in additional expense, and will unnecessarily deprive the City of the benefits of completion of the contract at an early date; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.



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
