Testimony to Portland City Council on the Shelter to Housing Continuum Project, Recommended Draft

Most all humans are suffering from stress/anxiety right now, and as and educator I will share that while I am sympathetic to this crisis and the many people affected by the economy and drug crisis - many of whom are not living outdoors, houseless people are an extremely common trigger for many children's anxiety. Not all children will be returning to in-person learning, and rely on the park as their classroom and/or recess space. We simply cannot use our parks if there are homeless people camping there. There has to be a better solution!
