To the Common Council. -

Gentleman

I here by submit my report
of investigation of the crematory
in burning the garbage.

I was at the crematory eleven
days in succession and I
found it could consume
a much larger quantity
than what they are getting.
They receive one scow of
garbage every day an average
of eleven and one half boxes
to the scow which is burned
very easy before the other
scow arrives, and with very
little wood.

The only odor about the crematory is when the men are dumping garbage in the furnace on the bell before it is let down, the bell being hot some garbage sticks to it which creates a little odor for a while till it burns off, but it is not offensive enough to amount to any thing. Other wise a person could not smell it.

I have talked to several of the farmers in regard of the crematory who did not think it was very offensive excepting Mr. Patterson. To give you some idea of the amount of fuel it takes to run the furnace, from the 29th to 28th there was seventy boxes of garbage it did not

exceed four cords of wood to burn the whole amount.

My opinion is that it will burn all the garbage the City will furnish.

To the Hon. Mayor and Common Council of the City of Portland, Oregon.

Gentlemen:- You have advertised for proposals for a crematory site and as several tracts near the city on the St. Helen's road are being discussed we as property owners and residents in ~~the north end of~~ the city do most Emphatically Protest against the selection of any of the tracts offered in that direction.

The city physician's report long since showed the existing and constantly increasing danger to the health of the city from the present location of the crematory and RECOMMENDED that the garbage should be taken down the river on scows and disposed of at a sufficient distance to remove all danger from our midst.

We also protest against the establishment of a crematory in or near any other quarter of the city as it would be a discrimination against and an injustice to any section to locate in their midst an institution which from its very nature ~~must~~ become a nuisance.

We also respectfully protest against the transportation of all the collected filth of our city exclusively through the streets when the river is most accessible for all. Forty teams could easily convey to the river all the garbage now moved by sixty teams. A saving could be made to individual citizens of \$70 per day if some accessible point on the river were selected. One or two barges could transport the accumulated matter to a crematory located down the river a proper distance for a small part of the \$70 per day that would be saved.

City ordinances are now in force forbidding the erection and maintenance of NUISANCES. It is a demonstrated fact that the best crematories, if erected in or near a city, become nuisances.

We therefore earnestly protest against the use of the city's money in locating in or near our city that which must unquestionably become the worst form of a nuisance.
