

## VICTIM OF THE STARMATIONS THE


Frank C Barlow, member of the Single Worker's Unemployment Council, died at the Clobe Hotel, February the 26 th. 1935. The doctors immedeatly attributed Barlow's death to a "heart attack", the usual alibi of capitalist doctors when an unemployed worker dies of starvation, and improper medical attention. Barlow was forced to work at the S.E.R.A. woodyard for no pay at all, when he should have been receiving medical attention at the heapital. When he asked to be sent to thehospital, the Belief Officials sent him to Grandma's Kitchen, the notorious slop shop known as a garbage distributor, where workers have droped dead in their tracks while waiting in line to be fed. Doctors at the clinic have stated that half of the workers who come to them from grandma's Kitchen for treatment suffer from severe stomach disorders.

Barlow fought against such conditions and was twice arrested for his activities in trying to abolish forced labor camps, into which the Single workers of Postland are being forced to starve, and for his activities in the recent Maratime strike.

The local papers have been spreading much ballyhoo about the transient camps: Three square meals, wages, medical and hospital care and even recreational and educational privileges; in other words, all the comforts of home.

WHAT ARE THE ACTUAL CONDITIONS?

We workers know about the actual conditions in these camps: The men are forced to work thirty hours per week for the sum of one dollar, the three square meals are little better than has been handed out on the soup line, quarters are crowded, tobacco is denied, unsanitary conditions prevail.

WHY THE FORCED LABOR CAMPS?

The capitalists seek to have the unemployed single workers, and others as well, to perform work in return for a starvation subsistance, and to work as scabs in the event of a strike.

They wish to use the forced labor camps as levers to slash the wages of the industrial worker, thereby reducing the wages of all workers to starvation levels.

They wish to regiment the unemployed single workers as a war measure.

## HOW CAN WE COMBAT THIS FASCIST

The slogan of the Single Workers Unemployment Council is to abolish

these wage-less starvation camps.

The S.W.U.C. is organizing the workers to smash all forms of forced labor; to gight for a wage of not less than fifty cents an hour; for thirty hours per week; and, if work cannot be furnished, not less than ten dollars cash relief per week.

The conditions of the SINGLE WORKERS that are UNEMPLOYED through no fault of their own are intolerable. Herded into SOUP LINES and FLOP HOUSES, DRIVEN to DESPATE by a system of DISCRIMINATION and FORCED LABOR. The SINGLE WORK-FRS have at last determined to STRUGGLE FOR THE RIGHT TO LIVE LIKE MEN.

Buletin No. 3 of the FEDERAL RELIEF ADMINISTRATION plainly states that there chall be NO LABOR PERFORMED for DIRECT RELIEF. For any labor performed, same shall be paid for at the PREVAILING WAGE SCALE.

Under the Burnside Bridge, we UNEMPLOYED WORKERS are forced to labor 2 hours per day for the "privilege" of eating on the SOUP LINE and FLOPPING at either the SALVATION ARMY, BORTLAND COMMONS, or GRANDMAS KITCHEN.

WI)E At least \$6 in cash per week. Not less than 50¢ per hour for all work, wood yard included.

2) All sick and disabled to be paid on this scale, in cash .

3) No discrimination on the basis of time in the city or county. on race, creeds, sex, color, political or economic opinions, or the kind of a "home" they live in.

4) Medical and dental attention and medicines to be furnished free. Patient to choose own doctor or dentist.

5) Recognition of all committees.


