Legislation title: Amend Upper Northwest Parking Definitions Code to revise the definitions of long-term meter and short-term meter (Ordinance; amend Code Section 16.35.110)

Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The purpose of the legislation is to revise the definition for a long-term meter and shortterm meter in the NW Parking District to prevent meter-feeding at meters that are more than 2 hours.

Current City Code 16.35.110 A – Upper Northwest Parking Definitions – defines an Upper Northwest Long-Term Parking Meter as any parking meter with a designated time limit of 1 hour or more. The proposed definition change would be revised to state: Upper Northwest Long-Term Parking Meter as any parking meter with a designated time limit of more than 2 hours.

Current City Code 16.35.110 F – Upper Northwest Parking Definitions – defines an Upper Northwest Short-Term Parking Meter as any parking meter with a designated time limit of less than one hour. The proposed definition change would be revised to state: Upper Northwest Short-Term Parking Meter as any parking meter with a designated time limit of 2 hours or less.

This would eliminate the ability of visitors parking at 2-hour meters in the NW Parking District to add time to the meter beyond the posted time limit.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

- There are no additional funds needed to complete this change. The budget will not need to be updated because of this request.
- There is no capital project or internal order number for this change.
- The staff time needed for these changes has been budgeted in PBOT's FY 2021-2022 Adopted budget.

Community impacts and community involvement:

- The changes will impact event attendees and anyone parking in the NW district.
- The changes will increase parking availability for non-event attendees to the NW District by creating turnover and reducing occupancy, however parking will be more expensive for all visitors to the area.
- The changes were recommended by the NW Parking District Stakeholder Advisory Committee and voted on during a public meeting.

• Outreach has been conducted to the Northwest Business Association (NWBA), Northwest District Association (NWDA), Goose Hollow Neighborhood Association, the Stadium Oversite Committee, and to the Timbers and Thorns organizations.
