# Authorize grant application in amount up to \$2 million to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance to assist the Police Bureau to implement a Body-Worn Camera Program

Passed

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) will provide grant funding to assist law enforcement agencies to implement, pilot or expand a Body-Worn Camera (BWC) program through the purchase or lease of BWC equipment (Exhibit A);
- 2. The City of Portland, Portland Police Bureau intends to apply for DOJ OJP BJA grant funding for the Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Grant Program FY 2022 Solicitation by May 25, 2022;
- 3. The solicitation states that there is Federal funding of up to \$2,000,000 for law enforcement and state correctional agencies' BWC programs. Eligible agencies can receive up to \$2,000 per BWC;
- 4. The grant period commences on October 1, 2022, with a performance period duration of 36 months; and
- 5. Match in funding is a requirement of this grant: Federal funds awarded under this solicitation may not cover more than 50 percent of the total costs of the project being funded.

### NOW THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- A. The Mayor is authorized to make application to DOJ OJP BJA for a grant in an amount up to \$2,000,000.
- B. The Mayor is authorized to accept on behalf of the City the BJA FY 2022 Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program to Support Law Enforcement Agencies award when awarded and to execute a grant agreement with the United States of America acting through its Department of Justice.
- C. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- D. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement
