



- 3 Street Plazas increasing street traffic for businesses






Central Eastside Together: Graffiti Removal

Central Eastside Together: Governance

- Diverse, Volunteer Board of Directors (10-20 members)
- 3-Year Terms; maximum 2 consecutive terms
- Formal Nominating Committee and Board Recruitment process
- Up to 3 Directors represent vulnerable populations (have lived experience of housing insecurity/houselessness)



Central Eastside Together: Transparency and Reporting

Reporting Requirements

- Monthly reports on Cleaning, Graffiti and Safety for All programs
- Public annual report presented to City Council at least once per fiscal year
- Quarterly public meeting to report on data and gather community members' concerns and feedback
- Annual survey of houseless individuals within the District regarding Central Eastside Together programs
