ORDINANCE NO. 152864

An Ordinance transferring identified savings through the second quarter of FY 1981-82 within various funds; transferring appropriation within certain operating bureau budgets, special appropriations and between funds; increasing resources and requirements in the Electronic Services Operating Fund; and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. On January 28, 1982, the City Council received the Second Quarter Budget Review for FY 81-82 in which actual expenditures were compared to planned expenditures on projects, programs and activities.
- 2. The report identified unneeded appropriation in several City agencies, as well as planned and new programs, projects and activities requiring additional appropriation.
- 3. On February 2, 1982, the City Council met in an informal hearing to discuss the program savings and requests for additional funds.
- 4. Sufficient appropriation is available within the various funds to accommodate implementation of the recommended projects.
- 5. The Budget Division of the Office of Fiscal Administration has prepared this ordinance transferring appropriation and increasing resources and requirements of various funds, consistent with the amended Quarterly Budget Review, and as indicated in Exhibits A and B, attached.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. That the FY 1981-82 budget is amended and appropriation is transferred within funds in order to reallocate savings and facilitate minor program adjustments in accordance with Exhibit A, attached.
- b. That the FY 1981-82 budget is further amended and appropriation is transferred within funds in order to fund increases to planned activities and new activities in accordance with Exhibit B, attached.

ORDINANCE No.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because it is necessary to adjust approprations without delay in order that appropriations reflect Council policy; therefore, this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
