ORDINANCE No. 153120

An Ordinance authorizing the execution of a stipulation for a back pay award in the amount of \$644.80 in the case of Charles T. Wenning v. Portland, authorizing the drawing and delivery of a warrant, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- On February 5, 1982, Administrative Law Judge Joseph A. Matera found that Mr. Charles T. Wenning had been terminated improperly from the job training program of the Training and Employment Division, Bureau of Human Resources.
- 2. That Judge Matera, as part of his order, awarded Mr. Wenning back wages in the amount of \$644.80.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- (a) The Mayor and Auditor are authorized to draw and deliver a warrant in the amount of \$644.80 payable to Charles T. Wenning, said warrant to be charged to the General Fund, Indemnities, BUC 41500506, Expense 490, in exchange for a signed release of all liability in this matter signed and executed by Mr. Wenning. Said warrant is to be delivered to Gary M. Georgeff, Deputy City Attorney, for delivery to Mr. Wenning.
- Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order that there be no delay in compliance with Judge Matera's order; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
