### **Vector Control Services Required**

- Rats living in the sewers leave the pipes from street inlets and service branches
- BES owns over 180
   stormwater quality sites
   requiring mosquito
   treatment and monitoring







## **Program Goals**

## JOINT CITY/COUNTY PURPOSES AND GOALS FOR THIS AGREEMENT

- Protect Public and Environmental Health, and Neighborhood Livability
- Provide Cost Effective and Efficient Services
- Monitor and Control the Vector Population in BES Facilities



#### **Vector Control Service Provider**

 Multnomah County has been providing health services to City since 1968 through multi-year Intergovernmental Agreements.

#### <u>Scope</u>

- Rodent Control and Surveillance program
- Mosquito Control and Surveillance program
- Vector control education and public outreach
- Community driven complaint response and investigation



### **Project Budget and Schedule**

- BES agrees to pay Multnomah County Vector Control a total not to exceed \$1,710,000.
- The annual not to exceed amount shall be \$342,000.
- The IGA is for 5-years
  - Effective immediately



## Revised 5-year Intergovernmental Agreement

- Reimbursement based on actual services performed (fullyburdened hourly rate)
- Billing rates will be adjusted annually for inflation
- Costs tied to assets for Asset Management tracking purposes
- Reporting of data and metrics spatially
