Emergency Ordinance

*Authorize Intergovernmental Agreement with the Oregon Department of Transportation for right-of-way services for the Outer Powell Transportation Safety Project

Passed

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The Oregon Department of Transportation is designing and constructing right of way improvements on SE Powell Blvd east of Interstate 205 known as the Outer Powell Transportation Safety Project.
- 2. At the conclusion of the construction ODOT intends to transfer jurisdiction to the City of Portland Bureau of Transportation.
- 3. The project requires a certain piece of right of way currently managed by the Portland Water Bureau.
- 4. PBOT and ODOT have determined that it is advantageous to the project for PBOT to acquire the right of way with reimbursement from ODOT.
- 5. ODOT has agreed to reimburse the PBOT for all costs related to the transaction not to exceed \$100,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- A. The Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Oregon Department of Transportation in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A.
- B. The Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to execute amendments, approved as to form by the City Attorney, to the scope of the services or the terms and conditions of this Agreement, provided the changes do not increase the total project cost by twenty percent (20%) or greater.

Impact Statement

Purpose of Proposed Legislation and Background Information

Authorize agreement with ODOT to provide funding for PBOT to acquire property from the Portland Water Bureau for ODOT's Outer Powell Transportation Safety Project.

Financial and Budgetary Impacts

This agreement will provide up to \$100,000 for PBOT to acquire a certain property from the Portland Water Bureau. The capital project number is T00891, and it is an ODOT project with PBOT reimbursed for services. There is no PBOT contribution to the project. The amount was determined based on the agreed upon value of the property and estimated PBOT staff time. The document is an intergovernmental agreement and requires council approval. ODOT is using their standard Right of Way Services Agreement with some amendments to avoid having to have legal counsel draft a special agreement.

Community Impacts and Community Involvement

The larger ODOT project has had extensive public involvement, this is an administrative manner related to the overall project.
