Christian Bryant has been working in the Real Estate and Property Management industry since the beginning of 2009. Vivien Lyon (they/them) is the Managing Attorney of a new eviction legal defense program administered by <u>PCC CLEAR Clinic</u>. They have practiced residential tenant defense since 2016, and they advocate for tenants and for legal reforms to address the gap in access to justice. Vivien is involved with several local tenant organizations and brings technical experience in navigating the legal system and handling issues such as eviction, habitability, and retaliation. They're a long-time renter in Portland, having relocated here from Chicago in 1999.

Statement of Interest:

I have roughly 5 years' experience representing tenants in Portland, both with evictions and with other issues that arise between landlords and tenants. I am well-aware of the legal obstacles tenants face in ensuring their rights are protected and it is this difficulty that I seek to address.

Regina Amodeo

Regina Amodeo (she/her) has over 12 years of affordable housing experience in the Portland Metro area, including Permanent Supportive Housing, Section 8 and Tax Credit programs. Regina understands the challenges of balancing regulatory requirements with trauma-informed and low-barrier approaches to housing access. She is an advocate for creative and equitable solutions to ending the housing crisis and experienced in building partnerships amongst agencies and communities to improve rental housing availability. She has a graduate degree in Public Administration from PSU and works at <u>REACH CDC</u> as the Manager of Compliance, overseeing the compliance functions of over 2,000 units of rental housing. She has lived in Portland since 2005, renting in many neighborhoods before settling down in Montavilla.

Statement of Interest:

For the past ten years, a large part of my job has included collaborating with governmental, social service and advocacy groups on issues around rental housing access and issues; bringing a trauma-informed approach to everything I do by evaluating the impact policy changes may have on applicants, residents, and staff.

Kristina Goodman

Kristina Goodman has been working with people experiencing housing insecurity or instability for several years. Kristina is currently the Housing Director for <u>New Avenues for Youth</u>. New Avenues is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the prevention and intervention of youth homelessness. Kristina's education includes an undergraduate degree in Health and Human Services and a graduate degree in Human Behavior. As a lifetime Portland community member, Kristina is personally invested in advocating for the city's residents and believes that we all deserve a habitable and affordable home.

Statement of Interest:

One of the programs that I manage serves LGBTGIA+ folks. The demographics of the clientele that I work with every day in all of our housing programs is largely marginalized people who have intersecting identities and are largely from communities of color. I am also personally committed to equity work in all areas of my life including those that reach beyond my professional role. As a parent of young folks who have intersecting identities this is especially important to me and is one of my guiding intrinsic values.
