It guts one of the most important parts of the plan. Title 24 protections must be restored. 3. As soon as this plan is adopted, the City must expedite developing floodplain protections on all industrial lands. These lands include some of our most important floodplains. It's time to stop talking about climate resilience and actually take steps to do something about it. I urge the PSC and the City to live up to their commitments to climate leadership.
