Re: Disturbance at NE Union
and Fremont

Sir:

At approximately 11:00pm East Precinct received a call to NE 7th and Fargo regarding a disturbance. It is understood that the difficulty began at a dance at that location. The people from the dance and the accompanying disturbance arrived at NE Union and Fremont at approximately 11:10pm. There were an estimated 250-300 people in the area from NE Grand to Garfield, and NE Fremont to NE Failing. All of the people appeared to be young (15-20yrs) NBC subjects. Only a few people were hostile, with the great majority apparently staying around to watch the action.

Damage was done to several business establishments and to police vehicles. District officer reports are not yet completed on the damage to property. All damage to police vehicles consists of broken windows and paint damage. There are no injuries to either police officers or civilians that the writer is aware of. Four male subjects were arrested for Disorderly Conduct, bail \$500.00.

North and East Precinct cars were assembled at N. Vancouver and Shaver, with officers left to guard the equipment. All other officers were placed four and six in a car. The short sticks had been distributed to North Precinct personnel. Personnel were instructed to patrol the area, make arrests where necessary, and to be certain that enough officers were present to control any incident where they became involved. The arrests made at NE Union and Fremont began in front of the pool hall, consummating in an altercation in the middle of the street. It is possible that the patrol wagon (#99) sustained some damage during this incident.

Units patrolled the area, made arrests, and broke up groups of individuals that were attempting to begin a disturbance. Individual officer reports are attached to this summary.

A command post was established at N. Vancouver and Shaver, with Lt. Miller remaining at that location. Supervision at the scene was accomplished by Sergeants Hulett, Schwartz, Higgins, and the writer. Sgt. Brouillette and his detail established a command post and assembled their equipment at NE Fremont and Garfield. This unit was not committed to the incident. Central Precinct cars were used to transport riot control equipment from East Precinct to the command post. North Precinct equipment was handled by the Sgts. No riot control equipment was used to the knowledge of the writer. Two patrol wagons were used, one parked at NE Union and Russell, and the other at NE Union and Shaver. Lt Quinn, one Sgt, and four Detectives remained on standby in the Detective Division. Inspector Springer and Captain Purcell were also at the scene.

During the height of the disturbance, the writer spoke on the telephone with a Mr. Martin, manager for the McDonald chain. After a description of the situation, Mr. Martin ordered the restaurant closed.

Approximately twelve (12) officers from East Precinct were involved. Seventeen officers from North Precinct participated, including all by one team from the Afternoon Relief. Coordination and cooperation of all officers present was excellent.

After the arrests were made and the situation relatively calm, all units were placed in their cars and removed from the immediate area. No further incidents developed, and the crowd began to disperse. We were prepared to clear the entire intersection of NE Union and Fremont if dispersal was not evident.

There was some difficulty in securing booking slips rapidly for the arrested subjects because the arresting officers were still involved. Identification Division should have been called, their function to include the use of a movie camera.

Inspector Springer was at the scene, and relieved Sgt Brouillette's personnel. Other units were placed back in service as conditions permitted.

Critique:

1. Use of a command post at N. Vancouver and Shaver appeared to be satisfactory. There is a good parking facility and easy access in three directions. There is no phone on the lot, but there is one on the corner across the street.
2. Identification and the additional wagon should have been called early in the disturbance. A movie camera should be available at the scene.
3. Training is needed in the area of team tactics and team arrests. Officers have a tendency to operate alone, even when obviously unable to control a situation because of the number of people involved.
4. A second radio net for command purposes could be established. Detective cars with Channel 2 or the Radar units could be used for such items as requests for # 99, tows, ambulances, and other communications that tie up the only available channel.

AT APPROX. 11:00PM, AS WE WERE LEAVING EAST REG. OFF. TODD AND MYSELF HEARD CAR 187 GET A CALL TO 3142 N.E. 5TH REG. A WOMAN SCREAMING FOR HELP. WHEN WE GOT THERE WE OBSERVED A NUMBER OF YOUNG NEG SUBJ'S. JUST LEAVING THE AREA OF IRVING PARK. AT THAT TIME SOMEONE FIRED WHAT SOUNDED LIKE FIRECRACKERS NEAR THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE PARK ON N.E. 7TH. SOMEONE YELLED THAT HES BEEN SHOT AND THE CROWD STARTED RUNNING TO 7TH AND FARGO. WE PROCEEDED TO THAT AREA AND OBSERVED A VERY LARGE CROWD GATHERED AROUND WATCHING A FIGHT. WE MOVED IN TO TRY TO BRAKE THE FIGHT UP. A SMALL NUMBER OF THE SUBJ'S. STARTED YELLING THAT THIS ISN'T WATTS OR CHICAGO, AND CURSING THE POLICE IN GENERAL. WE PUT A CALL OUT FOR COVER AND STAYED THERE TRYING TO DISPURSE THE CROWD, WHICH AT THIS TIME SEEMED TO HAVE GROWN TO APPROX 250 OR 300 PERSONS. A NUMBER OF THESE PERSONS WERE OVER HEARD STATING THAT IT'S TO BAD WHEN A FEW COULD CAUSE ALL THE TROUBLE. AT THIS TIME WE WERE APPROCHED BY ONE OF THE PARK PERSONEL ASKING US TO PULL BACK AND LET THEM TRY TO QUIET THINGS DOWN THEMSELVES. WE DID JUST THAT AFTER INFORMING SGT. HUELETT OF THIS AND HE AGREED. AN ATTEMPT TO FORM ALL THE CARS IN ONE AREA AWAY FROM THE AREA WAS MADE BY THE EAST AND NORTH SET'S. AND WE WERE TOLD TO STAY IN THE AREA TO OBSERVE. THE MAIN CROWD MOVED TO THE AREA OF N.E. UNION AND FREMONT WHERE THEY STAYED ON THE STREETS AND SIDEWALKS. THEY WERE DOING SOME DAMAGE AS THEY WERE MOVING ALONG. WE MOVED UP TO McDONALDS AND COULD HEAR GLASS BREAKING DOWN UNION AND ASKED FOR THE CARS TO MOVE IN. WE WENT DOWN UNION FOUND THE ALARM RINGING AT THE 98 CENT STORE. IT LOOKED AS IF WAS STILL SECURE SO CON'T. MOVEING ABOUT THE AREA. WE THEN PARKED OUR CAR ONE BLOCK SOUTH OF FREMONT ON UNION AND WALKED BACK TO FREMONT. AT THIS TIME WE TRYED TO KEEP THE PEOPLE MOVEING AND OBSERVED TWO SUBJS FIGHTING IN FRONT OF THE POOL HALL. WE WERE TRYING TO BREAK THEM UP AND DIDSO. ROY JOHNSON, 19 NEG, INTERFERED AND WAS ARRESTED. WE THEN STAYED IN THE AREA UNTILL MOST ALL WAS CLEAR.

IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT WHEN WE FIRST HAD CONTACT WITH THE CROWD AT 7TH AND FARGO, I SAW A NUMBER OF VERY SMALL CHILDREN AMONG THEM. ONE VERY SMALL GIRL CAME UP TO ME THAT COULDN'T HAVE BEEN OVER 6 OR 7 YRS OLD CRYING THAT SHE HAD LOST HER SISTER AND WANTED HELP. SHE WAS DIRECTED TO OUR POLICE CAR BUT WAS GONE WHEN WE GOT BACK TO IT. (WHY WERE THESE YOUNG CHILDREN PERMITTED TO BE OUT ~~##~~ TO THE DANCE AT THIS HOUR?)

SIR

RADIO CALL 8:18PM REGARDING LOUD PA. UPON OUR ARRIVAL WE OBSERVED APPROX 50 COLORED CHILDREN STANDING AROUND THE TENNIS COURT AREA ON THE SOUTH END OF IRVING PARK AND A RECORD PLAYER PLAYING VERY LOUD AND EAR SHATTERING. WENT OVER AND TALKED TO THE SUBJ WHO STATED THAT THEY HAD JOINED ALL THE NEIGHBORING HOUSES AND ASKED IF THEY COULD PLAY WITHOUT CREATING A DISTURBANCE AND THE NEIGHBORS HAD SAID THAT IT WOULD BE ALL RIGHT.

I REQUESTED THAT THEY TURN IT DOWN A LITTLE BIT WHICH THEY DID AND THEY WERE VERY COOPERATIVE STATED THAT THEY WERE PLANNING TO HAVE A PARK DANCE WHICH WOULD BE SPONSERED BY THE C-CAPS AND THE CITY PARK FOR THE COLORED AND WHITE CHILDREN TO GIVE THEM A LITTLE ACTIVITY. FELT THAT THIS WOULD HELP GIVE THE KIDS SOMETHING TO DO.

STATED THAT IF THEY HAD ANY TROUBLE THEY WOULD CLOSE IT DOWN AND IF THINGS WORKED OUT THEY WOULD LIKE TO HAVE THE DANCES AT LEAST ONCE OR TWICE A MONTH.

CONTACTED SGT ROGERS AND INTRODUCED HIM TO SEVERAL OF THE PARK EMPLOYEES WHO WERE THERE. THE SUBJ FROM C-CAP WAS NOT THERE AT THIS TIME. SUGGESTED THAT THEY TURN THE LOUD SPEAKER TOWARDS THE PARK AREA ~~XXXX~~ RATHER THAN THE STREET AREA WHICH THEY DID. AT THIS TIME THERE WAS APPROX 100 TO 150 BOYS AND GIRLS IN THE AREA. UPON CHECKING BACK BY AROUND 9:50PM WE OBSERVED OVER 200 CHILDREN RANGING FROM 14 TO 19 YEARS OF AGE IN THE AREA. A BAND WAS SUPPOSE TO BE THERE AT THIS TIME AND APPARENTLY THEY WERE HAVING TROUBLE FINDING AN AMPLIFIER. HAD BEEN INFORMED THAT THE DANCE WOULD ONLY LAST UNTIL 11:00PM. SGT ROGERS AT THIS TIME HAD GONE INTO THE PARK AND WAS CHECKING OUT THE SITUATION. EVERYTHING APPEARED QUIET AND CALM AT THIS TIME.

Sir; re radio call at 813PM re a loud PA system in Irving Park, NE 7th & Fremont. Upon our arrival we contacted three Park officials and Officer Stohl informed these individuals that there had been a complaint lodged from an anonymous caller re their loud PA system. It may be noted at this time that the Park officials were holding a combination jazz concert and record hop. One of the officials a Mr Linzy Roy approx 30 yrs, 1234 N Emmerison, NBC stated to Officer Stohl that he would tone the PA system down. This was done as the record player was toned down, Mr Linzy stated that at 9PM a band would be playing in place of the record player. At this time approx 825PM, there were approx 80 to 100 subjects gathered, some dancing, the rest were sitting and milling about on the tennis court. We withdrew from Irving Park itself but remained fairly close by for a meet with Sgt Rogers. Prior to our meet with Sgt Rogers we were proceeding south on NE 7th, when a group of NBC subjects emerged from a 56 Chev, Oregon ERV 244. There were numerous insults yelled at this writer and Officer Stohl re our skin color, rotten cops, various profanities and the word WATTS was mentioned. This writer and Officer Stohl decided not to stop our vehicle to talk to the NBC subjects for fear of a crowd gathering.

Upon our meet with Sgt Rogers at NE 7th & Monroe this writer and Officer Stohl informed him of the situation in Irving Park also the fact that the crowd had grown considerably in numbers - totalling at this time (100m) to 300 or more

At this time, Sgt Rogers, Officer Stahl and this writer returned to Irving Park where again we talked to Mr Kingy. Mr Kingy stated that although the crowd had increased he was definitely sure there would be no trouble. Sgt Rogers stayed at Irving Park while we resumed normal patrol however we remained in the vicinity of Irving Park. At approx 1020PM this writer and Officer Stahl, proceeded to NE 8th, and contacted Sgt Rogers at the Dead End street at Irving Park (south side) and NE 8th. Sgt Rogers informed us that the band had started playing, that there were a few scuffles but that there was not a problem of any major importance aside from the fact that the crowd had, at this time totalled approx 300 subjects.

Upon our arrival at East precinct at 1045PM, this writer and Officer Stahl were informed by Sgt Rogers that at Miller requested, myself and Officer Stahl to work overtime until the dance broke up. At approx 11PM we received a radio call to the location of NE 8th re a girl screaming for help. Upon our arrival at 1102PM we saw nothing to the effect of a girl screaming however what this writer did see, was complete chaos. Approx 150 subjects were running across the Park toward NE 7th and Fargo. Covering on this call was Car #53 and both units proceeded to NE 7th and Fargo. Observed approx 150 NBC subjects, milling around, on the street and sidewalk. There were one

or two small fights, and together with Car 53, tried to break them up. Also tried to control crowd on street and sidewalk. At this time this writer was approached by an unknown NBC subject approx 18 yrs. He accused this writer of being a white m f, a m f cop, with m f helmet. He asked me "if I thought I was in Watts and dared me to hit him. Backing him up were approx 30 NBC subjects yelling profanities egging him on. At this time our cover units arrived, that we had requested upon our arrival at NE 7th & Fargo. We retrieved to our car, and at this time this writer was hit with a wine bottle on the left wrist and fingers. The bottle was thrown thru the air by an unknown subject striking this writer on the left wrist. The bottle did not break on impact, however the left hand and fingers are very sore, and stiff. The wrist is not broken but probably just sprained, however it is ~~beginning~~ to swell.

This writer proceeded to my patrol car as I was instructed to do so by Officer Stohl to stay in the car as radio monitor. The crowd at this time started moving North on Fremont, hurling stones and pieces of wood at the Officers themselves and the patrol cars. This writer stayed on as radio monitor and thru radio Sgt Huellet told all

units to re-group at NE Union & NE Broadway.

While at this location Car # 53 called for immediate cover at NE Union & Fremont as the crowd was smashing windows and hurling debris. This writer, Officer Stohl, and Officer Sheridan proceeded to NE Union and Fremont. Upon arrival saw three or four large groups, some at McDonalds and some running in the streets west on Fremont. This writer assisted fellow officers as best I could in arresting NBC subjects and helped place them in Car # 99 with Officer Stohl. Again upon another re-group at Vancouver & Shaver, were told to remain outside perimeter of Union & Fremont. We did so until all groups were broken up. During this meter and my observation of such, the subjects involved were mostly juveniles, in the age bracket of 16 yrs to 20 yrs. There was no harassment whatsoever at Irving Park re the dance.

At NE 7th & Fargo, there were no arrests made, and this writer and Officer Stohl did not touch anyone, only informed them to break up when the subjects started throwing debris at us.

About 10:05 PM we checked at the end of 8th Street where Sgt. Rogers had stopped also to check.

at this time there was no music and the group appeared normal with a few leaving we circled the PARK and observed auto's parked at curb all around 7th St. Area.

SIR: AT 11:40 PM IN THE AREA OF NE UNION/FREMONT, THERE WAS A LARGE DISTURBANCE OF YOUNG PERSONS AT THIS INTERSECTION. WHILE PATROLING IN THE AREA, THE SUBJ STEVENSON WAS SEEN EARLIER, I HAD TALKED TO HIM AT NE 7/FARGO, WHERE A DANCE HAD LET OUT AND AT THIS TIME HE WAS VERY VULGAR IN HIS LANGUAGE, CAUSING A LOUD DISTURBANCE. THOSE WERE THE EXACT WORDS, VERBATIM I TOLD THE SUBJ TO BE QUIET AND TO GO HOME, AND AT THIS TIME HE BECAME VERY VULGAR AND USED MANY WORDS OF PROFANITY. PLACED HIM UNDER ARR FOR DIS COND, AND HE WAS PLACED IN THE WAGON, HAD TO USE FORCE TO DO THIS, IT WAS NOT NECESSARY TO HANDCUFF HIM. JUST HELD HIS HANDS BEHIND HIS BACK. AFTER BEING PLACED IN THE WAGON, HE BECAME VERY VIOLENT, KICKING AT THE BACK DOOR AND BREAKING AND BENDING THE BACK WINDOWS AND BARS OF THE PATROL WAGON. ON ARRIVAL AT JAIL, ADVISED HIM OF HIS CIVIL RIGHTS, OFFERED HIM THE PHONE TO CALL AN ATTY, AND GAVE HIM INFO RE POSTING BAIL. UNK WHERE THE SUBJ WAS DOING HIS DRINKING AS HE WAS VERY VERY UNCOOPERATIVE AND BELIGERANT. ON CHECKING HIS RECORD, FOUND HE HAS A LOCAL RECORD OF MISSING, LARC FRM BLDG, INFO MORALS, 5 JWALK CITATIONS, 2 FIRS, WARR LISTED FOR LARC FRM RESIDENCE, LARC FROM DRIVE IN, 5 TFC ARRESTS, 2 MAL MISCH, LARC FRM SER STATION, TRESPASS, JUV MOLEST, CURFEW, ASSLT AND ROBB AND AWDW.

LAWSON WAS ALSO ARR AT THIS TIME CHG DIS COND, AND AT THIS TIME OBSERVED HIM ON THE CORNER AND HE WAS VERY LOUD AND BOISTROUS AND USED WORDS OF PROFANITY, HAD JUST RUN FROM ANOTHER POLICEMAN, AFTER THROWING AN OBJECT. STOPPED TO TALK TO THIS SUBJ AND TOLD HIM TO PLEASE GO HOME AND GET OFF THE STREETS AS WE HAD QUITE A PROBLEM HERE. AT THIS TIME HE INFORMED ME THAT I WAS "A MOTHER FUCKING ASS HOLE, HAD NO REASON TO GO HOME, WAS GOING TO STAY THERE ALL NIGHT AND WASN'T GOING TO MOVE, OR DO ANY FUCKING THING". I TOLD THE SUBJ HE WAS UNDER ARR FOR DIS COND, HE WAS PLACED IN THE WAGON, ALONG WITH STEVENSON, BOTH KICKED AT THE REAR OF THE WAGON, BANGING THE BACK DOORS AND BREAKING SOME GLASS THERE. LAWSON HAS TFC, RAPE, CURFEW, MAL MISCH, FIRS, LARC FRM AUTO, 2 INTELL FILES, #2296 AND 2293 AND LARC FROM STORE.

During the altercation on aside area I was working the desk at East Precinct. I was working alone. During the altercation and after I had the occasion to answer many phone calls from differand people. I had approx 25 phone calls regarding the desturbance. Most people calling requested information regarding what was happening. I received several calls from people who informed me they were colored and asked if they could be of any assistance. Several of the colored callers stated they were ashamed the way the young colored people were acting. At no time was there any mention of Police brutality.

After the area had quieted down approx 6 young colored boys came into the precinct and requested information regarding one of their friends that had been taken into custody. I called jail and found the subject in question was under arrest. On talking to the boys, they were all very quiet and (~~plmks~~) polite. When I gave them the information they requested the were not unruly or did they cause any trouble. They did stated that they had attempted to quiet the arrested subject down and get him away from the area. They stated they had done their best to help the Police and prevent the desturbance. The friend they were inquiring about was LAWSON, ROBERT W.

Off duty Officer Jernigan called this precinct and wanted to know if all the off-duty officers were being called back to work. He stated he had heard on radio station KISN that all off duty personnel were to report for work.

During the desturbance one west side car came to the precinct and picked up 36 long police battons. They were returned when the situation quieted down.

Sir: While on our way out to the district at approximately 11:15 PM Car # 53 called for cover at N.E. 7th & Fargo. Went to the scene and observed approx. 300 N.B.C subjects which were congregated across the street from Irving Park.

The crowd began to break up at the arrival of the extra police cars, but as they moved away they were throwing beer bottles, cans, and wine bottles; some of these missiles being directed at the Off. at the scene. As the crowd was beginning to move away a Park coun-selar, who had been supervising the dance asked that the Police leave the area stating that "he felt that he could persuade the people to go home. The East Prec. cars then left the area except for # 53. and met at N.E Broadway and Union ave. where we teamed up 4 men to a car. Car #53 called saying that the crowd was breaking windows at Union & Freemont. Upon arriving at this scene observed that the crowd was throwing rocks, bricks, beer&wine bottles. Several subjects were arrested at this scene but although the Off. were armed with night sticks at no time did I observe anyone using them to strike any of the crowd even though several Off. were hit by thrown missiles. I saw one flash bulb go off, but I did not see the photographer.

Sir: In response to Radio call from Dist. car # 53, for assistance to N. E. 7th & Fargo, I proceeded to the area and observed a large gathering of young

people, est. 300 milling around throwing bottles and rocks, fighting, etc. We were notified by Officer Todd that the Park Director thought he could handle the situation. We were then ordered to form at Union & Broadway. At the time I arrived on the scene also other Police units I could hear many young people say, I want No part of this, I'M going home.

After leaving the area and forming again the progress of the large group was tracked to McDonalds where again trouble broke out again. On my arrival at the scene on Union & Fremont I observed a large number of people out on the street. Mostly adults who stood by and observed the goings on. In making progress west on fremont, rocks were thrown beer bottles, and cursing & yelling. Behind the tavern several adults told us that some punks had picked up beer bottles and had thrown them at the windows of passing autos. Most of the adults behind the tavern were moving or out trying to protect their autos. As we progressed west on Fremont groups of juveniles had formed and we observed several pick up rocks to throw at us or passing autos. All the property owners on Fremont were out or coming out of their homes to run the juveniles away from their property. The juveniles who threw the rocks and bottles at us usually were behind the crowd of other young people and we separated several from the now spectators and chased them approx four blocks. Other young juveniles would chase us shouting encouragement to the ones being persued. This cleared the area of a considerable number and broke them up into smaller groups.

Upon return to Union & Fremont some officers were struggling with one colored subject and after taking him aside and listening to some good comments from people who had observed the incident, he was released. Order was maintained, but the area was becoming ~~maxxi~~ heavily populated with spectators. We moved away to a nearby location and remained until relieved.

cover car 57 in regards to a woman screaming in front of 3142 NE 8th. This
call was nothing but young girls leaving the dance at Irving Park. It was
from this location we first observed a large groupe of about 300 juveniles
and young adults gathering and fighting at NE 7th and Fargo. We proceeded
to this location and called for a couple more cars to assist. Car 57 ar-
rived immediately. We entered the crowd to break up a fight that was in
progress. It was at this point that this point that someone started throw-
ing wine bottles. I returned to the car and call for more cover and the
wagon. Upon arrival of more help the crowd was move slowly to NE Cook.

During this movement a subject known to us as Herman Oscar Stevenson,
was calling us "Blue helmeted, white mother-fuckers." and similar names
while gathering his friends around Him. He was also yelling that the cops
had hit him in the head with a night stick and slugged him. To the best
of my knowledge he was never touched by a police officer. As the group
moved north on NE 7th I was approached by the park rec. directors who stated
that they thought that they could disperse the crowd if we moved from direct
contact with the crowd. I relayed this information to Sgt. Huelett, who in
turn gave the order for us to withdraw. We then proceeded to NE 7th and
Fremont, the Plaid Pantry parking lot, so that we could observe the direction
and progress of the crowd. The majority of them proceed down Fremont to
to Union and Fremont. During this movement numerous subjects we throwing
bottles, kicking cars, and causing general disorder. As we moved down Fre-
mont to Union and into MacDonalds parking lot the crowd appeared to be start-
ing to break up, eventho some of the subjects were still throwing bottles

It was during this struggle with the above a Oregon Journal photographer took pictures of us. He got his car in the way of Sgt. Walkers wagon and was told by myself to get out of the way.

Upon talking to bystanders and Older adults who were there, the general opinion was that of disgust and anger towards those involved in the disturbance. Shortly after this, we left the immediate area, staying in the background as the crowd filtered on home.

The above mentioned photographer was the only one that I saw in the area. There were several parents on the seen that I know by sight only, that were gathering up their children in disgust and telling others to go on home.

We were also assisted by the two previously mentioned park directors.

It was not known by us what the age limit was for the dance, However, there were children in the age group of app. 5yrs to 10yrs present through the time.

Sir: At approximately 11:00PM, Thur., 7-14-66 I covered a disturbance at NE 7th and Fargo from the station.

A few minutes earlier Cars 53 and 57 had been sent to 3148 NE 8th regarding a woman screaming. Upon arrival they found a large group leaving a dance at Irving Park which was sanctioned by the Park Bureau. A fight started at NE 7th and Fargo and they attempted to break it up some of the crowd began throwing wine bottles. They called for more cover.

When I arrived the crowd was approximately 250 to 300 milling around. The street was covered with broken glass. Officer Tedd contacted me and stated the Park Directors thought they get the group to break up if we left the immediate area. I ordered the cars to regroup at NE Broadway and Union. I left car 53 Officers Todd and Kagey as a scout car to watch the crowd and keep us advised.

Car 53 followed the crowd as they progressed toward NE Union and Fremont where North Precinct Cars were forming. The crowd at this point began throwing bottles at passing autos and the officers at the scene. They also began to break windows of the business establishments on Union. Car 53 called for more help so I had all men at Broadway and Union go to Union and Fremont.

Upon arrival there found people running in all directions with a large group in front of the pool hall across the street from MacDonalds. The street was littered with glass and bottles were being ~~thrown~~ thrown from the crowd. Two men were arrested and placed in the patrol wagon and they immediately kicked the windows and cracked the glass. I sent the wagon from the area to prevent any attempt to release the prisoners.

I contacted Sgt Walker of North Precinct who was also at the scene. He suggest we regroup at N Vancouver and Shaver and set up a command post. We had all cars proceed to that location where men were placed in four and six man cars and told to patrol the immediate area. ~~Offix~~ Lt Miller was in charge of the Command Post where the surplus cars were left under guard.

The crowd began breaking up and in a short while the area was quite clear of people on the street. About this time traffic became quite heavy as curiosity seekers began arriving at the scene in their autos. It was apparent the local radio stations were broadcasting information regarding the incident.

During the incident four persons were arrested for Disorderly Conduct bail set at \$500bt Lt Miller. Lt Miller requested they be questioned by Detectives to see if this was a pre-planned incident or not.

During the incident only one officer received a injury of note. Officer Callaghan was hit on the hand by a bottle thrown by an unknown person. His hand had started to swell by the time he finished his shift.

Lt Miller requested that all officers write a report covering his activities during the incident. These were to be turned in before they went home.

It should be noted that even though all officers had batons none were used on any of the persons participating in the incident. The officers conduct was very commendable in all cases involving the situation.

SIR: AT APPROX 11:10 PM, 7/14/66, I WAS ADVISED THAT A DISTURBANCE HAD DEVELOPED FOLLOWING THE DANCE AT IRVING PARK. THE DANCE HAD BEEN SPONSORED BY G-CAP AND THE PARK BUREAU AND WAS ATTENDED BY ABOUT 250 TO 300 NBC YOUTHS.

ON MY WAY TO THE SCENE, SGT WALKER, NORTH PREC, SUGGESTED THAT A COMMAND POST BE SET UP AT N VANCOUVER/ST. CLAY. I CONCURRED AND PROCEEDED DIRECTLY TO THAT LOCATION. IT WAS A GOOD LOCATION BEING EASILY ACCESSIBLE, WELL LIGHTED AND ABOUT 6 BLKS FROM THE MAIN ACTION. CARS WERE ALL LOCKED EXCEPT THE DRIVERS DOORS, KEYS PUT ABOVE THE VISORS, AND THEY WERE FACING AN EXIT SO THAT ANY ONE OF WHICH COULD BE REMOVED WITHOUT DISTURBING THE OTHERS. A TELEPHONE WAS ACROSS THE STREET.

SGT HULETT, EAST PREC, AND SGTS WALKER, HIGGINS AND SCHWARTZ OF NORTH PREC, PATROLED THE DISTURBANCE AREA, SUPERVISING POLICE ACTIVITIES AND ADVISING THE COMMAND POST OF THE SITUATION.

CENTRAL PREC PROVIDED 2 TEAMS, ONE TO DRIVE THE EXTRA WAGON AND ONE TO TRANSPORT THE BATONS FROM EAST TO THE COMMAND POST. NONE OF THE A RELIEF WAS HELD OVER.

THE 5, 1 MAN, 2ND NITE TRAFFIC CARS, PRIMARILY ANSWERED PREC RADIO CALLS. ALTHOUGH 2 TRAFFIC MEN ASSISTED TEMPORARILY AT THE SCENE. SGT NICHOLSEN KEPT 7 OFFICERS OVER FROM THE 1ST NITE RELIEF.

DET LT QUINN KEPT A SGT AND 3 TEAMS OVER FROM 1ST NITE. 2ND NITE DETS INTERROGATED THE ARRESTED MEN. THE INCIDENT WAS APPARANTLY SPONTANEOUS. THE PRIMARY RESENTMENT TOWARD THE OFFICERS SEEMED TO BE IN THEIR USE OF HELMETS. SEE DET BENSON'S REPORT FOR DETAILS.

I DID NOT CALL ID DIV TO TAKE PICTURES, WHICH WAS PROBABLY MY GREATEST ERROR.

ALTHOUGH RADIO DID A COMMENDABLE JOB, THEY ACKNOWLEDGED A REQUEST TO INFORM CAPT SULLIVAN AT HOME, BUT HE WAS NOT NOTIFIED UNTIL I DID SO AFTER THE DISTURBANCE HAD BEEN COMPLETELY QUELLED.

THE BASE FOR THE PATROL WAGONS SHOULD HAVE BEEN THE COMMAND POST, BUT I NEGLECTED TO DIRECT THAT THIS BE DONE.

5 OUT OF 7 TEAMS OF E RELIEF MEN AND 9 OUT OF 11 N SHIFT MEN AT EAST PREC, RESPONDED TO THE DISTURBANCE. 17 NORTH PREC OFFICERS COVERED.

SGT BROUILLETTE WITH 9 MEN ESTABLISHED A BASE OF OPERATIONS AT THE SCHOOL AT N E GARFIELD AND BEECH. THEY WERE NOT CALLED INTO SERVICE, BUT INSP SPRINGER, WAS PRESENT TO DO SO, IF IT HAD BECOME NECESSARY.

OFFICERS PATROLED IN 4 OR 6 MAN CARS, BREAKING UP GROUPS AS NECESSARY. THE TENOR OF THE MINORITY OF THOSE WHO HAD BEEN AT THE DANCE, WAS HOSTILE AND VIOLENT. HOWEVER, MOST WERE PASSIVE AND SOME WERE IN VOCAL SUPPORT OF THE POLICE. THERE WERE SOME VERY SMALL CHILDREN IN ATTENDANCE PROBABLY LESS THAN 10 YRS OF AGE.
