Investing in Portland

The City of Portland is receiving a grant of \$208 million through a part of the American Rescue Plan Act. All reporting data about these investments is available in this Rescue Plan Open Data Portal. We are collecting and sharing information about project outputs and outcomes. This includes demographic and spatial data about recipients and partners.

Recipients are individuals and organizations (businesses or non-profits) served by City of Portland Rescue Plan projects. Partners are organizations helping to implement projects.

Data updates quarterly. Data shows progress through September 30, 2022.


