## Why am I receiving this notice?

## What is this project about?

The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS) is proposing to amend Portland City Code, Title 33 (Planning and Zoning) to require all new multi-dwelling and mixed use development with five or more units - that include onsite parking - to provide electric vehicle (EV)-ready charging infrastructure at higher rates than required by State rules. The amendments include developments standards that will apply to EV charging installations.
