

## **Purpose**

**Purpose.** The Planning Commission makes recommendations to City Council on the City's long-range goals, policies, and programs for land use and planning.

In making recommendations, it considers the economic, environmental, and social well-being of the city in an integrated fashion.

The Commission has specific responsibility for guiding, developing, maintaining and updating the City's Comprehensive Plan and zoning code.

The Commission deliberates using a climate and equity lens and is committed to effective public involvement and leadership in its work.



### **Powers and Duties**

#### Powers and duties.

- 1. Holding hearings and making recommendations to City Council on proposals to adopt, amend and update: the Comprehensive Plan; the zoning code; significant transportation policies, projects, and issues; the portions of Title 11, Trees, identified in 11.10.040.C; urban renewal plans; street vacations; sign regulations; and renaming city streets;
- 2. **Advising on plans and policies** regarding such issues as housing, transportation, urban design, equity, economic development, public buildings, environmental protection, resource conservation, and other policies of citywide interest;
- 3. **Providing a forum for community members to learn** about principles, policies, and programs that promote sound land use planning practices.






